There are Three determinants when calls include a patient, BLS, ALS1, and ALS2.

- BLS: Basic Life Support Minimal Injuries if none
- ALS1 Requires One Paramedic, commonly used if patient is experiencing chest pain, decreased level of consciousness, or if protocol deems it necessary
- ALS2 Requires Two Paramedics, used for serious incidents: Cardiac Arrest, severe injuries or unconsciousness. PIC that involves entrapment, unconscious or ejection.
