Analysis:

Tuesday night's Nationals-Pirates matchup delivered far more fireworks than usual, with tensions flaring after Washington reliever Jorge López threw a pitch near Andrew McCutchen's head, sparking a benches-clearing incident. López was promptly ejected, and Pittsburgh capitalized—Oneil Cruz launched a grand slam off Eduardo Salazar, adding drama to a series not typically known for it. It was arguably the most memorable Nats-Bucs game since fans at PNC Park staged a walkout in 2007 protesting former owner Kevin McClatchy. Looking ahead, Andrew Heaney has quietly impressed in his debut stretch with Pittsburgh, posting a 3.00 ERA through his first three starts. On the other side, Trevor Williams comes off a rough outing against Miami, where he was tagged for six runs on eight hits in under five innings. With momentum and a pitching edge, the Pirates are worth a look on the moneyline. The public is backing us on this one as well, with 68% of the money on Pittsburgh.

Analysis:

The Tigers took a lopsided loss in Milwaukee on Wednesday, but there were a couple of silver linings. The early start allowed Detroit to return home at a reasonable hour, and the blowout nature of the game meant their top bullpen arms got a day of rest. That could be valuable as they return to Comerica Park, where they've posted a strong 5-1 record so far. Meanwhile, Kansas City rolls into town riding a tough stretch — this will be their seventh straight road game without a day off, and they haven't had a full rest day since April 3. Their bullpen is showing signs of wear after a tight 4-3 loss in New York on Wednesday. With Michael Lorenzen and Reese Olson squaring off on the mound — two arms that don't inspire much confidence — this feels like more of a situational play, with the edge going to the fresher Tigers at home. The public is heavy on Detroit in this matchup, with 73% coming in on them.
