- 2. Review current fee structure
- 3. Accessibility to transportation
- 4. Activity fair/increase knowledge of options for students at different buildings

Communications + School/Home Partnerships

- 1. Educate about communication tools and procedures already in place (high school students can receive announcements)
- 2. Ensure District expectations are carried out by teachers in the use of Schoology and SeeSaw to create a more consistent student and family experience
- 3. Foster intentional connections with students, parents/guardians, and teachers
- 4. Enhance school-to-home and classroom-to-home communication

Culture & Climate

- 1. Education for students, staff, and families about similarities and differences related to race, culture.
- 2. Looking at people as individuals teaching from multiple perspectives = **very important and needs more education**
- 3. Define "excellence" in our District

Curriculum & Instruction

- 1. Personalized Learning: multiple ways to demonstrate and engage in learning
- 2. Review and investigate pathways to provide a variety of cultural perspectives in the areas of American History, Literature, and other subjects
- 3. Professional Development for student voice & choice (personalized learning)

Harassment & Bullying

- 1. Restorative Practices / Professional Development / Additional Staff Support Education for students, staff, and families

Social Media

- 1. Educating students, families, and staff on the pros and cons of social media

Special Education

- 1. Education, awareness, and inclusion
- 2. Accessibility in school and transportation
- 3. Programming transitions between buildings and opportunities during school day

Student Support Services

- 1. Increasing staff support for mental health
- 2. Increasing the awareness of community partnerships and school-linked resources
 - a. Access to food
 - b. More inclusive menu options
 - c. Therapist, mental health
 - d. Supporting families
 - e. Chemical health
- 3. De-stigmatizing support services

Technology

- 1. Education about current tools/resources available for parents/guardians, staff, and students including Learning Management Systems (Schoology and SeeSaw) and Skyward
- 2. Work with families needing home internet access
- 3. Finding the balance of using technology in educational settings

Transitions between buildings

- 1. Develop consistent mentorships starts strong with SOAR (grade 6) and SPLASH (grade 9), but helpful to continue during year
- 2. Review how grade levels are supported from building to building (tours, preview days, staff visits, etc.)
- 3. Developing a system for teacher-to-teacher communication regarding individual students
- 4. Enhance parent/guardian communication for building transitions
