#### **Woodbine Halt**

Woodbine Halt, Bewdley, is a newly renovated annex studio attached to Woodbine Villa, which is our home. It has been named due to its close proximity to the famous Severn Valley Railway with views of the viaduct from the little viewing platform in the outside seating area.

The annex has its own private entrance and contains a stylish double bed, seating area with a colour television, and a separate kitchen and eating area. The kitchen has a combination oven/ microwave/grill with a small induction hob, kettle, toaster and coffee pod machine and all utensils. Just perfect for those wanting to cook the occasional light meal or snack. There is also a shower room/WC. Outside there is private parking for one vehicle and a pretty and secluded seating/dining area. With an ideal location, just 5 minutes from all the amenities of Bewdley town and 3 minutes walk to the Severn Valley Railway station, this makes it ideal as a vacation/short break stay for couples.





Just two minutes drive from **The West Midlands Safari Park** makes this town an ideal holiday/short break destination.


Packed with restaurants, pubs and riverside cafes, there certainly is no shortage of eateries.

# **West Midlands Safari Park-** *just 5 minutes drive from Woodbine Halt*










An award winning safari and Leisure Park located in Bewdley. Visit the self-drive safari and see the animals close up from the comfort of your own car.

The park holds over 165 species of exotic animals and features other attractions such as a small theme park.

The park contains the largest groups of white lions, cheetahs, hippopotamuses and meerkats in the uk. Visitors can drive their own vehicles through the park along the trails and also book a VIP Tour experience!! A definite must visit for anyone with an interest in wildlife.

Wyre Forest with visitor centre, bike hire & Go Ape- 10 minute drive from Woodbine Halt



Whether you're looking to escape the hustle and bustle of everyday life, or you want something more adventurous, Wyre Forest has something for everyone.

Enjoy a variety of scenic walking and cycling trails, or do something a little more strenuous and book the 'Go Ape' experience (bike hire is available) and top it off with refreshments at The Forest Cafe situated in the Wyre Forest visitors centre.

There is also a Parkrun at 9am on a Saturday morning, if you're feeling energetic!











### Severn Valley Railway- just 3 minutes walk from Woodbine Halt



If you love Steam trains, visit the Severn Valley railway. Opened in 1862 after a 9 year building project, the Severn Valley railway was originally part of the much longer Shrewsbury to Hartlebury Line until 1948 when the government nationalised the railways.

Jump aboard the award winning heritage line, with vintage steam and diesel-hauled trains. Commencing in Kidderminster and terminating in Bridgenorth, the SVR has the most beautiful route with stunning scenery. You can hop off and back on at the various stations along the way and enjoy lunch and a beverage. Regular themed Steam and diesel Galas run throughout the year.







# **Severn Valley Country Park** just 20 minutes drive from Woodbine Halt





Set in the peaceful, scenic valley of the River Severn, the park provides 126 acres of beautiful countryside and riverside banks. The visitors centre provides information on the park, a cafe and toilets. There are also 3 picnic sites and a large car park. For all those energetic travellers, there is a Park Run that takes place on a Saturday morning at 9am.





# **Ludlow Castle and Ludlow town** 40 minutes drive from Woodbine Halt





Ludlow castle is a ruined medieval fortification in the English county of Shropshire, standing on a promontory overlooking the River Theme. It was one of the first stone castles to be built in England. The town of Ludlow is well worth a visit. The townscape is based on the original Medieval town plan and features architecture from the Medieval, Tudor and Georgian periods, with over 500 listed buildings.

Described by country life as "the most vibrant town in the country"it is a pleasure to amble through the streets and check out all the speciality shops and independent boutiques.



# Hartlebury Castle incorporating Worcestershire County Museum just under 15 minutes drive from Woodbine Holt





Hartlebury Castle is a Grade 1 listed building, sitting on a 43 acre estate, built in the mid 13th century as a fortified manor house given to the Bishop of Worcester by King Burgred of Mercia.

The Bishops Palace can be explored with audio guides, talking portraits and interactive displays.

Today it also houses the Worcestershire County Museum, and cafe. From captivating costumes and vibrant vardos (gypsy caravans) to fascinating archaeology and ancient children's toys, there is something for everyone. There are also regular family craft events and outdoor cinema screenings to enjoy.

#### Hartlebury Common just 15 minutes drive from Woodbine Halt







Hartlebury common is one of Worcestershires most important nature reserves. It is a site of Special Scientific interest, especially noted for its wild plants and the many species of moths and butterflies. Heather dominates the lower terrace and specialist flowers, such as Shepherds Cross, Sheep's Sorrel and delicate Lilac Harebell flourish. Birds include the Yellowhammer, as well as a variety of woodland birds. Long-horned cattle roam and graze freely across the whole common. These were specially selected for the common due to their tolerant and docile nature. They co-exhist with the walkers, dogs and horse riders.

#### Bewdley Museum just 5 minutes walk from Woodbine Halt









Housed in a historic 18th century butchers shambles, this unique museum provides a fascinating insight in to the growth and trades of the town, the lives of the people, and the crafts of the surrounding Wyre Forest area. It now contains galleries, displays, and hands-on activities.

The Garden kitchen cafe, herb garden and watermill and the Queen Elizabeth 11 Jubilee gardens provides an area for quite contemplation and features a recently restored orchard.




#### Arley Arboretum just 15 minutes drive from Woodbine Halt



These beautiful historic gardens and arboretum date back to the 1700's and are surrounded by over 1600 acres of countryside within the picturesque village of Upper Arley, beside the River Severn. In addition to providing wonderful walks through the 300 ancient trees, there are walks along the banks of the river, all set in the beautiful Worcestershire countryside with far reaching views. The Italian garden with feature fountains and formal planting, the Magnolia arch, 65m Laburnum arch, Camilla Walk and Acer arch are amongst the best displays. There is a wonderful garden tea room, serving homemade food and delicious array of cakes and speciality hot and cold drinks.

Throughout much of its length the Severn remains a natural waterway, wild and unspoilt. Dippers, Little Ringed Plovers, Herons, Swans, dragonflies and otters are examples of wildlife dependent on the river. It contains nearly every native of freshwater fish, including salmon, Trout, eels and coarse fish.

It is the unspoilt state of the Severn that gives the canoeist some of the best journeying river to be found in Britain.

# Fishing on the River Severn in Bewdley 'Tight Lines and Bent Rods'!





Bewdley has three sections – Hawkbatch (pegs 1-51) which is above Dowles Brook and only open to members, Dowles (pegs 52-72) which runs from Dowles Brook down to the town and Winterdyne (pegs 73-120) which runs from the town down to Ribbesford.


Pegs vary from fast, 3ft deep white water, excellent for barbel, chub and dace in the summer, to steady 4ft deep stretches – great for silver fish when the river is low and barbel when there's water on, to even deeper, steadier water which is good for barbel all year round and for silver fish in the winter.

During the summer, pellet feeder tactics are best for barbel and big roach, while long whip, stick and waggler approaches produce lots of dace, perch and chub.

In the winter, pellet feeder and meat work well for barbel in coloured water but maggot feeder is best when the water is clear. waggleand bolo work well for roach, dace and chub in the colder months although long whip can also be very effective. **Happy Fishing!!** 

# **Kinver edge sandstone caves** just 20 minutes drive from Woodbine Halt







Kinver edge is a high heath and woodland escarpment on the Worcestershire/Staffordshire border. Discover the history of the quirky rock houses here, and what remains of an iron age hill fort. There are several rock houses that have been curved out of the soft red sandstone, dating back to 1777. There are stoves, furniture, windows and doors- all set into the sandstone, just as they were when the houses were lived in. The rock houses made good homes, cool in the Summer and warm in the Winter.

The Worcestershire Way begins in Bewdley, 8 minutes walk from Woodbine Halt and ends in Malvern, or vica versa.



This walk takes you from Bewdley to Great Malvern where you can enjoy splendid views of the Malvern Hills.

The path starts on the River Severn in Bewdley and heads south, passing the villages of Abberley and Martley on your way to Great Malvern. The walk also takes you through the delightful Ravenshill Woodland Reserve and the Teme Valley where you can enjoy a short riverside section along the River Teme. The final section is particularly lovely as you pass through the glorious Malvern before finishing in the town of Great Malvern. You can extend the walk by continuing to the southern end of the Malverns and visiting the British Camp Iron Age Hill Fort on Herefordshire Beacon.
