I realize that change fee is shitty news on top of an already shitty situation so on the off-chance that you do decide to reschedule your wedding and I'm not free for the new date, let's talk. I value you and want to make this situation as good for all of us as possible.

Please let me know of any questions or concerns. **This email is simply a reference to answer any questions that might be on your mind right now regarding our work together.** Unless we discuss otherwise, our work together will NOT change from the original plan.
