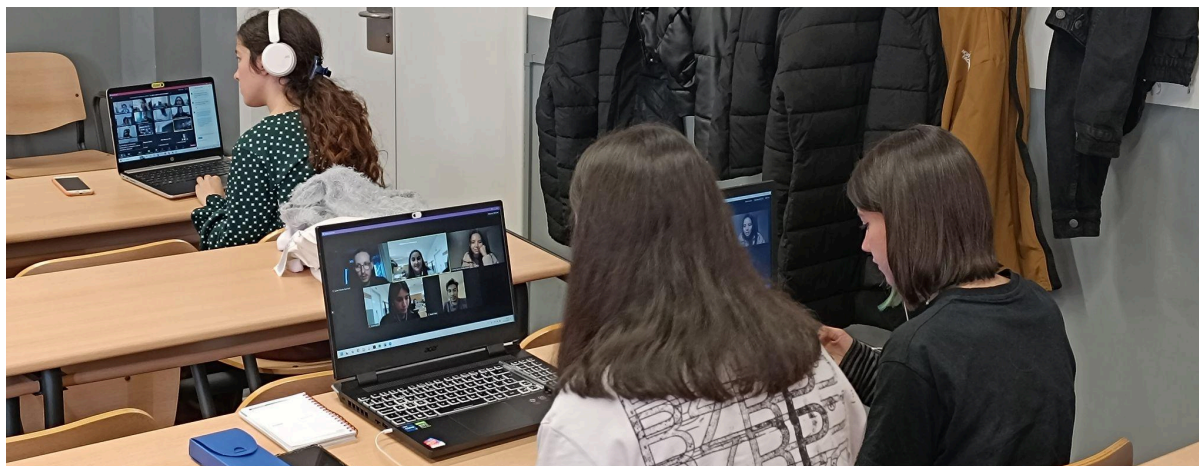


PLANNING YOUR COIL/VE PROJECT

The aim of this worksheet is to help you to plan a basic COIL project which you could use in your own classes in the future.
