

The largely misunderstood reason for American success

Prescriptum: All human minds, wherever and whenever they exist in this vast universe, and in whatever bodily form, including those who have the form of those in our own solar system, are equal in the eyes of our common Creator, since all have a potential role within the unfolding of history, and each, by adding their own creations, benefits all others.
