## II. Materials Needed

This course has no required materials other than those provided by the school. Recommended materials include: pens or pencils, lined paper, highlighters, headphones, and planner (paper or digital such as Google Calendar). Students may read books for independent reading that are brought from home or borrowed from a public library. Students may choose to purchase their own copy of any text we read if they wish to write in it.

# **III.** Academic Integrity

### PLAGIARISM AND CHEATING

<u>Plagiarism</u> is using/stealing, intentionally or unintentionally, another person's ideas, concepts, research, pictures, graphs, statistics, etc. without in-text documentation and a "Works Cited" page.

<u>Cheating</u> is copying another student's work as your own, using your phone or laptop to go to apps or sites that do the work for you, using any unauthorized materials during an assignment/assessment.

The consequences for plagiarizing and cheating are significant and can tarnish your reputation with your teachers and other students here at ELHS. The first offense will result in the following consequences:

#### **First Offense**

- 1. You will be required to discuss the specifics of your transgression with the teacher and an administrator who discovers your plagiarism or cheating.
- 2. Your parents will be notified by the teacher.
- 3. Your other teachers will be notified by the teacher.
- 4. A notation will be placed in your Powerschool information file.
- 5. You will receive a 50 for the assignment. You will be allowed to redo the assignment, and the credit you receive for it will be averaged with the 50. For example, if you redo the assignment and earn a 90, you will receive a 70 as the final score (90 +50 = 140; 140/2 = 70).
- 6. If you choose not to redo the work, you will receive a 50 on it.

## **Subsequent Offenses (In any class)**

- 1. Steps 1 through 4 will be followed.
- 2. The offense will result in a grade of 50 with no chance to make up the work.

A grade of 50 on a significant assignment could result in a failing grade for the class. That would entail making up the whole class. Teachers and administrators at ELHS encourage all students to achieve their highest academic potential. They want all students to develop characteristics that will give them the best chance to be successful adults: integrity, honesty, and trustworthiness. **If you are concerned about plagiarism or cheating, ask your teacher for guidance.** 

Students caught plagiarizing or cheating who are members of Student Council or the National Honor Society could be up for additional consequences according to the guidelines of each organization.

Students involved in extracurricular activities who are caught plagiarizing or cheating and are under contract will be subject to the guidelines stated in the extracurricular contract.

Dual enrolled courses may have more severe consequences for plagiarism and cheating policy per specific colleges.

# V. Student Grading and Evaluation

## **Traditional Scoring Scale: 50-100%**

- A semester score of 76% and evidence that a student has met proficiency in the required learning targets is required to earn a ½ credit for the course.
- A score of 50 is the lowest mark a student may receive. Any score below 50 will be recorded as a 50. A mark of "MI" for missing will be added to the grade for any assignment that is not turned in.
- At the end of the semester, if students have learning targets they have not met, an "Incomplete" or "In Progress" grade will be posted as the overall percentage score and **NO** credit will be awarded.

## **PowerSchool**

- Teachers will be required to post assignments, formative assessments, and summative assessments in PowerSchool for the upcoming week by the close of business on Friday. (The same expectation as the syllabus)
  - o For late assignments, teachers will post "MI" in PowerSchool which will automatically enter a score of 50 for that assignment.
  - Collected student work will be marked in PowerSchool by Wednesday each week.
  - Student work will be graded and reported in PowerSchool bi-weekly, on Wednesday. These dates correspond to the bi-weekly reporting of student responsibility grades in PowerSchool and are the same week of extracurricular eligibility checks.
- Some parents will need support, training, and resources on how to access PowerSchool and how to use it to check on student progress. Parents can access support on the ELHS Student / Parent Guide 2021-22

#### **GRADING SCALE**

50% Summative Assessments	30% Formative Assessments	20% Student Responsibility

50% Summative Assessments: Assignments/tasks that demonstrate student learning and should be connected to targets and/or course objectives. This should be for "unit" completion. This would also include the "final" exam for the course, which can be weighted the same as two summative assessments.

30% Formative Assessments: These are pieces of evidence that represent progress towards the targets or course objectives. These assignments enable students to participate in class on a daily basis, and may include, but are not limited to, in-class assignments, homework that is graded on correctness, reflections on class activities, quizzes, and tasks that inform the student and teacher on the progress toward learning.

20% Student Responsibility: Every two weeks a Habits of Work grade will be given. Each criteria will be evaluated separately but will be averaged together to get an overall 'student responsibility' grade.

### LATE PENALTIES FOR COLLECTED WORKS

- If a student has not completed the week's assignment(s) by the due date, the teacher will contact the student to make a plan to get caught up. Parents will be contacted if the student fails a summative or if there is a concern about a pattern of incomplete assignments. If a student has not completed the week's assignment(s) by the due date, attendance during the FLEX period is mandatory until the student is passing, even if the student has Early Release Privilege.
- Late work will impact a student's Student Responsibility grade as well as the assessment.

- There will be a max point reduction of 15 points on late work. This includes summative, formative, and other foundational work. Late work will receive a penalty of five points deducted from the grade. If extenuating circumstances exist and an extension is discussed with the teacher before the due date, the due date will be determined by the teacher.
- If an excused absence occurs on the date the assignment was due, then the assignment is due the day the student returns to class.
- For late assignments, teachers will post "MI" in PowerSchool which will automatically enter a score of 50 for that assignment, until the assignment is completed and scored.
- Formative work is not accepted for credit after the respective summative assessment is complete.
