##### Welcome and Introductions

- Matt spoke with Nova Scotia Salmon Association. Apparently a Watershed Alliance similar to PEI's was previously considered in NS. There are concerns that this proposal will duplicate the effort/compete with the Adopt-a-Stream program.
  - Someone should meet with them in next 1-2 weeks to try and get on same page
- Sandy Lake - Sackville River is a good case study showing why there is a need for a NS Watershed Alliance to fill roles not currently filled by existing programs like Adopt-a-Stream
- Use time to describe PEI Watershed Alliance and the strides the Water Caucus has made in establishing a cohesive body of watershed groups in NS, survey results summary,
  - Be prepared for them to cite Adopt-a-Stream
- Be sure to link our discussion/question to NSECC mandate
  - Why would they want to fund it?
  - What are their pain points? How would funding address some of those?
- Make them understand how committed Nova Scotians are to protecting water, doing it on shoestring budget
  - NSECC should not just acknowledge this symbolically, but materially
  - We acknowledge the need for economic development, but we can still protect watersheds too
- Avoid yes/no questions
  - How can NSECC help
- Minister Halman is genuinely interested in the environment
  - Karen has had encouraging experiences with him, but his environmentalism tends to get lost in politics
- Lead 1-pager with problem statement and NS focus, talk about PEI later in 1-pager
- Chris to ask NSECC tomorrow about what is the right approach to establish relationship/conversation going forward
  - Maybe the 1-pager is more appropriate for a future meeting
- We should explicitly state that we are meeting regularly (hours met in 2025) and we are functionally organized with staff support
  - Get some numbers on meetings, volunteer capacity and contributions

- All agree to take a more generalized approach on Nov 25 without proposing specific funding models
  - Chris will draft a question here and ask for feedback from the group
  - Anna, Sheri, Elizabeth, and Shanna in particular may have input but could not attend today

The atmospheric river in Nova Scotia in 2023 resulted in over \$170 million in insured losses whereas every dollar invested in action now avoids more than \$17 in future damages.

Can a report be funded on the costs and opportunities of watershed management in the province? We would like to explore a model for securing dedicated funding that learns from the success of the PEI Watershed Alliance.

Thank you for your consideration. We too wish for our communities to grow and urge you to consider that the average sale price of homes in flooded communities is 8.2% lower with more days on the market.
