





High School Art Happenings

Graphic Design & Digital Arts



Graphic Design and Digital Arts students have been discovering the versatility of Adobe Illustrator this semester. Students started off with simple shape manipulations and then learned how to create patterns. To complete their pattern unit, students focused on a theme and a demographic to create a holiday based wrapping paper. Students had to avoid cliches and think outside of the box. Then the prototypes were printed and students learned how to wrap a gift and make a high quality, handmade bow. Additionally, students learned logo design after creating their own candy company to market. Students learned how to manipulate typography and incorporate

various design elements. Currently, students are creating a charity box for a PAWS Bangkok fundraiser while considering their target audience.

Students have explored a wide variety of tools and processes which have resulted in amazing projects, but they have also given students useful skills that can be applied to their lives outside of school. All skills they learn in class are entirely transferable which makes Graphic Design and Digital Arts the perfect class for Life-long Learning and Complex Thinking.


TCIS Trips → All approved trips shall be communicated through official letters on school letterhead and signed by Mr. Tom or Kru Rung.

November AP Update



Dear Parent / Guardian,

If your child has already signed up for AP coursework, they have more support than ever to help them learn throughout the year and prepare for AP Exams, where students have the opportunity to earn college credit!

Our team of AP teachers remain dedicated to providing your child with a powerful learning experience this year, and because we know the importance of parent involvement, we have a few updates to help your child stay on track:

- Make sure your child uses the join code their AP teacher gives them <u>to join their class</u> <u>section</u>. This will give them access to AP Classroom where they can practice their skills, receive feedback on their progress, and see real AP Exam questions.
- Remind your child to watch AP learning videos. Starting on September 1, short, on-demand learning videos called "AP Daily" are available in AP Classroom. AP students can watch these at their own pace on a mobile device or a computer with internet access, or teachers can assign them as part of their curriculum. These are available for most courses.
- Know that May 2021 AP Exams will cover the full course scope and content because colleges expect it. And if our school buildings are closed in May 2021 due to safety concerns, the AP Program will provide a contingency option for AP Exam testing. We expect to know more about this in early 2021.

AP Scholar Award Levels

The AP Scholar Awards are academic distinctions for students to cite among their credentials on applications and résumés. Students do not receive any monetary award from College Board.

Award	Criteria
AP Scholar	Granted to students who receive scores of 3 or higher on three or more AP Exams
AP Scholar with Honor	Granted to students who receive an average score of at least 3.25 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams
AP Scholar with Distinction	Granted to students who receive an average score of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams
AP International Diploma	Awarded to students who display exceptional achievement across a variety of disciplines. See eligibility requirements.

Note: The AP Capstone Diploma[™] and AP Seminar and Research Certificate[™] are reported to colleges and universities as AP Scholar Awards and appear in Scholar Roster reports.

The AP International Diploma (APID)

The AP International Diploma (APID) is a globally recognized certificate awarded to students who display exceptional achievement across a variety of disciplines. Available to international students attending secondary schools outside the U.S. and to U.S. high school students applying to universities outside the country, the APID certifies outstanding academic excellence with a global perspective. (But it's not a substitute for a high school diploma.)

Students don't need to apply for the APID; it's automatically awarded in the year all eligibility requirements are met. The College Board notifies students by email after the award has been conferred. Students may self-print an APID certificate from AP Scores.

APID Eligibility Requirements

- Students must score a 3 or higher on 5 or more AP Exams.
- Exams taken multiple times only count once—the highest score will be used for award calculation.
- Students must attend a school outside the U.S. or U.S. territories, -OR-
- Students attending a school within the U.S., U.S. territories or the DoDEA network must send AP score(s) to a university outside the U.S.
- Exams must fulfill the following content areas:
