Volleyball High Net	 Team Launch Volleyball: Volleyball rules with parachute cooperative skills Bounce Volleyball: Volleyball rules with mandatory bounce rule before each hit. Raquet-Volleyball (Rolleyball). There is Eclipse ball out there similar to this. Volleyball + Tennis. Use racquet for striking.
Badminton: Medium Net	 Whamball Volleyball rules + closed fist hits. Optional bounce rule. Sepak Takraw Volleyball with soccer striking. Feet only. Volley Tennis Volleyball + Pickleball. Use pickleball paddles for striking.
Pickleball: Low Net	 Futpong (or beginner's level Sepak Takraw) Volleyball + soccer. Feet only for striking. Volley Tennis Volleyball + Pickleball. Use hand for striking. I like using high bounce foam ball. Nitroball Volleyball rules. Mandatory bounce rule. Hit downward motion.

Video Delay

- Try these: BAM Video Delay
- o Or use Camera function and replay.
- Students video self working on skills. Video replay loop of On/Off rotation.
 - Self-assess or peer feedback (PE Standard 1 Skills focus)
 - o Provide learning cues or skill breakdown so they know which areas to focus on.
 - o Comparing themselves to skill posters for skill development.
- Video during game play.
 - Teams self-assess game play what is going well and on how to get better (PE Standard 2 Strategy focus)
 - Teams take turns rotating off to watch video and reflect. 3 teams total. 2 teams playing against each other with a video recording. 1 team off watching their game play video (if you have 2 ipads). With only 1 ipad, have the team watch their game play for 2 minutes and record the current game play for 2 minutes (giving you a 4-minute game) and then rotate teams accordingly.
