What problem does it solve?

During the past decade, there has been an increase in the intensity and impact of conflict and violence on civilians globally. Landmines and unexploded bombs can remain in the ground for decades after a conflict has ended.

Small arms and ammunition are regularly stolen and trafficked across borders and illicitly traded, fuelling more armed violence against civilians. Weapons and ammunition are often stored in or near built-up areas where an unplanned explosion can have devastating consequences.

Landmines, bombs, small arms and ammunition need to be found and destroyed.

Why should someone vote for it to be funded?

- Humanitarian values. Wars come and go but the aftermath leaves people living in danger and fear for years. Half of landmine and unexploded bomb casualties globally are children; no child should pay the price for war.
- *Poor communities*. These conflicts usually take place in the poorest parts of the world so the affected local communities lack the resources to pay for these services themselves
- High skilled work is needed that is expensive. Work is painstaking, checking minefields
 metre by metre using metal detectors and other excavation tools; mine detection dogs
 trained to sniff out explosives; and specialised armoured machines to destroy the mines.
- Support local empowerment. Where possible, workers are locally recruited to understand where landmines and unexploded bombs are located and to help them raise awareness of risks within their community.
