
Wrap Up Section

INTRO:



Congratulations! You and your students have completed the Possible Selves curriculum on Future Quest Island-Explorations! Throughout their journey, each student described their hoped-for and feared possible selves and used the information to create a visual representation of their Possible Self. Student reflections are represented by growth of different elements of their Possible Selves Tree and in their portfolios.




Possible Selves can influence goals students set and their action plans for reaching those goals. It can also impact students' academic engagement and achievement. Using this framework, teachers can support students in envisioning positive outcomes in school and life by helping them be intentional in

exploring strengths and weaknesses, developing realistic short- and long-term goals, and making plans to achieve those goals.

Embedding Possible Selves exploration activities into Future Quest Island-Explorations, may provide a critical foundation for early college and career awareness, self-concept, and social-emotional skills for elementary students with and without disability.

1. Certificate of Completion

When the student completes all 21 items, the mentor will notify them that they received a very special certificate of completion that they can print out.




The certificate can also be saved as a PDF and will always be available on their Possible Selves Tree.



2. Final Review of Student Portfolios

Take the time to review each student's portfolio. Remind the student to complete the writing prompts and design the section heading, if they haven't already been completed as recommended throughout the curriculum.




Student's can print and save their portfolios so they can reference them in the future. Portfolios can be shared by the student to their families, specialists, and other school personnel.

3. Student Summary Pages

This 2-3 page document summarizes student responses by section and provides a consolidated student profile which can be used for instructional planning, parent-family conferences, or IEP meetings. Summary page categories include:

- Personal characteristics
- Preferences and strengths (what I like and how I am) as a person, friend, learner, work and friend
- Hopes (what I hope to do) as a person, friend, learner, work and friend
- Goals (what I plan to accomplish) as a person, friend, learner, work and friend
- Careers I am interested in


- Challenges
- Needs or things to help students grow as a person, friend, learner, work and friend



4. Fidelity/Feedback


As a reminder, our team will be collecting information on each activity in each unit. Please make sure you do the following when you've completed the curriculum:

1. **Completed/skipped activities** - for each activity, please make sure to let us know whether you completed or skipped the activity by clicking on the appropriate radio button.




Once you choose a button, a **checkmark** will appear next to that activity within the unit.
