PHIL 107, “Intro to Religious Studies”

Why do religions form? What role do they play in people’s life? Across societies, how does religion influence the development of cultures, social institutions, and political processes? Find out with PHIL 107, “Intro to Religious Studies!” The course covers a broad array of historical and contemporary religious traditions. It also provides a theoretical background on religion as such, drawing on prominent sociological, anthropological, philosophical/theological, and historical theories. In addition to satisfying **general education** requirements, it is a great gateway toward a minor in Philosophy and Religious Studies

PHIL 491, “The Problem of Evil”

“God is good. God is omnipotent and omniscient. Evil exists in the world.”

The problem of evil, summarized in these statements, is both a theological and philosophical problem that has plagued theologians and philosophers alike. Individuals and societies continue to strive to make sense of the existence of evil in the world. PHIL 491, “The Problem of Evil” will provide students with an accounting of the major historical, philosophical, and religious efforts at making sense of evil. It will also propel students, regardless of background or perspective, to develop *their own* answer to the problem of evil. This course is **open to all students**, across years and majors.
