

The Women's Prize for Playwriting Script Submission 2025

Section 1: Overview

Thank you for your interest in submitting your play to the Women's Prize for Playwriting 2025!

In this form, you'll be asked to:

- confirm that your submission meets our eligibility criteria
- give us your name and contact details
- tell us about your play
- fill out an Equal Opportunities form, describing your professional and personal background.

Questions with an asterisk (*) are compulsory.

Please note that submissions should not be anonymous. You may use a pseudonym if you wish – we just need a valid email address so that we can contact you.

Reading

Once we've got your script, we'll assign it to our panel of expert readers, which includes theatre professionals from a range of backgrounds, locations and professional roles.

The readers and Prize team will then work to determine a longlist, which we expect to announce in early October – and, for there, we'll select a shortlist to send to our judging panel.

Judging

Our judges are experts in their field, spanning theatre, arts and the media.

From our shortlist, they'll pick the winner of the Women's Prize for Playwriting 2025 – who will be announced in December.

The data we collect

The Equal Opportunities section of the submission helps us to understand who is submitting to the Women's Prize for Playwriting, and their journey to doing so.

We use it to evaluate our work and strategy, both internally and for our funders.

- aged sixteen or older
- resident in the UK, Republic of Ireland or in a British Overseas Territory, or have a British Forces Post Office address.

Submitted scripts must:

- be written for stage
- be an original work (i.e. not an adaptation)
- last an hour or more in playing time
- not have been professionally produced (i.e. no more than five ticketed performances, and no professional reviews)
- not have received any other prizes or awards.




