Games

Board and Card Game Club (Ages 11-18):

Does your child love games? This club will be a great opportunity to get together weekly with game enthusiasts. We will play a variety of board and card games both from our own collection and from those available to rent in the back of the game store. We'll work with several game styles, both competitive and cooperative and will focus on good sportsmanship. We will also do a little cross-curricular exploration with games that help with vocabulary, spelling, math, reading, science, and social studies topics.

If they are interested, students will spend a few weeks near the end, after experiencing different kinds of games all semester, designing their own board games from scratch that they will get to take home once completed. If creating a game doesn't peak their interests, students will continue gaming as usual while others make games.

Classes will be held at the [Wyoming branch Kent District Library](#). The rate is \$10/session. This class is drop in with no need to commit to the entire school year. I just need students registered so I have contact with parents and ask that I get a heads up when students will be coming so I can plan our games based on turnout.

D&D Club (Ages 13-18):

Have you ever wanted to fight a dragon? Have you ever wanted to explore cave systems that stretch for miles? Have you ever wanted to cast spells that reshape the very world around you? Have you ever wanted to battle evil, to argue with kings, or to commune with literal gods? In Dungeons and Dragons, all of these acts are possible. DND is a roleplaying, live action game, played with a set of dice, your willpower, imagination, and a Game Leader who guides the sessions and their direction. The limits are nearly boundless! But you, the player, become the most important factor, for when calamities strike, where will you be? What will you do? But most importantly, what will you learn about yourself, in making this choice on behalf of your character? The Gods walk the earth, and so will you. What sort of adventures will you pursue?

My name is Jay, and I'll help guide you on this adventure as Game Manager. I am the voice of your best friends and allies, I am the Kings and Queens, I am the dragons and fiends- I am those you vanquish, and those which vanquish you. Welcome, friends, to DND!
