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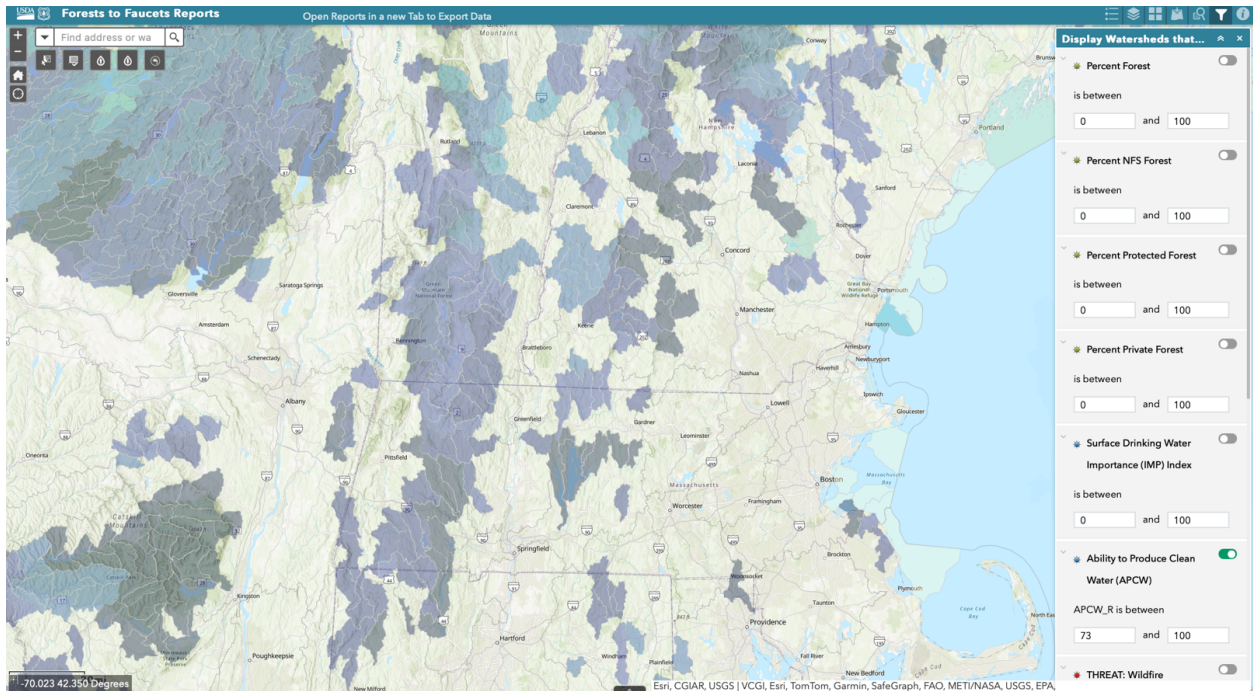


Fig. 1: Map of Regional Forests with 73–100% Ability to Produce Clean Water, USDA Forest Service

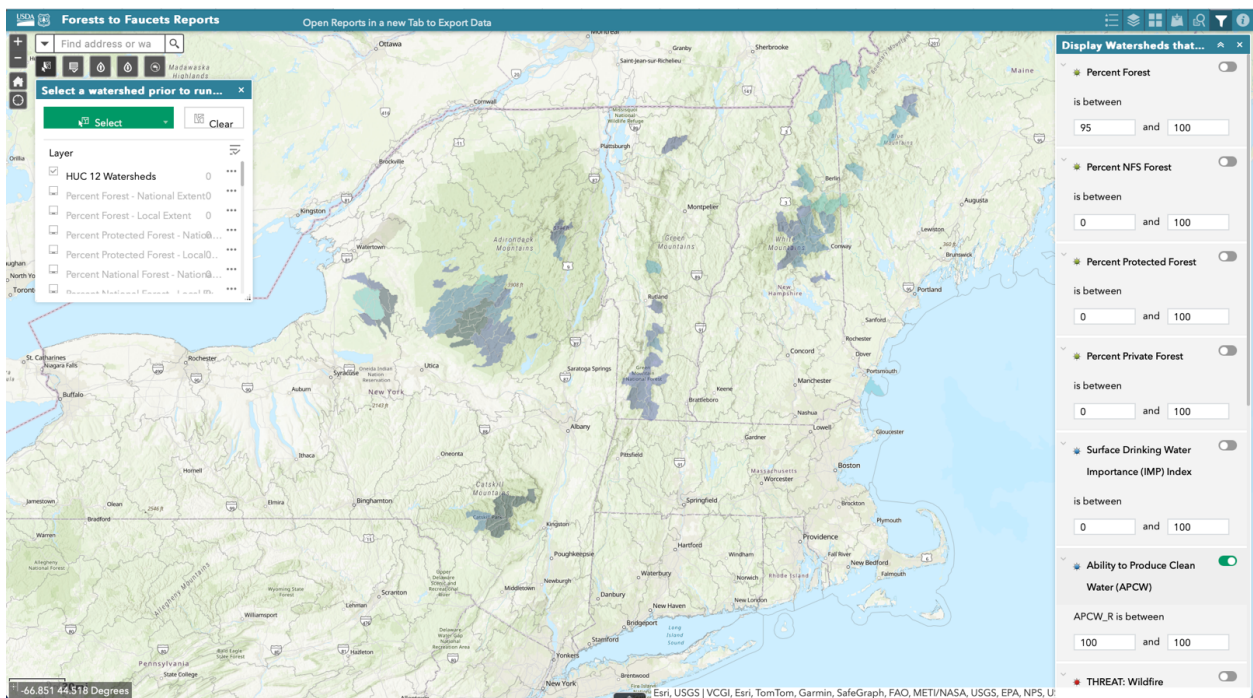


Fig. 2: Map of Regional Forests with 100% Ability to Produce Clean Water, USDA Forest Service
