Classroom Procedures and Work: The goal of this class is to meet the Common Core State Standards and to become the best readers and writers our students can be. We will do this through sustained silent reading (SSR) and conferencing, book talks, book talk projects, classroom discussions, creative writing, articles of the week, etc. At the start of the class period, students are expected to be seated at their desks quietly, with their SSR book that they are reading or starting other bellwork i.e. grammar. They need to make sure they enter the room with their required daily supplies to be successful for the day. Homework: Homework will be given out as needed to reinforce a skill that we, as a class, are working on. All assignments are expected to be turned in on time and complete.
