

Drinking from the River of Forgetfulness: Polaroid Stories

This play is one that is meant to make you wide-eyed and uncomfortable in the most necessary sense. It will allow you to mirror a well-known person or relationship to each of the other characters you meet throughout the show, and if not; you will emphasize to the full extent. Each of them felt forgotten, see-through and lost-wanting to "disappear". I enjoyed this mostly because I've been taken through the turmoil of addiction and dragged out of it as well. It is an important part of our society to understand and acknowledge. My favorite part was 'Happy Girl,' I think her accent was on point. I loved watching everyone from class and seeing what they can really do. Unfortunately, I couldn't make it to The Rover, I really wanted to. I'd like to make it to a theatre club meeting and try to get involved in next semesters productions. I told my mom about this one, and she thinks that her high school put on this play before too. (she could be wrong)

We experience the present toxic relationships around us, the codependency that comes along with it, "I know you like I know myself," feeling heart-broken when someone chooses addiction over you, seeing someone kill themselves/OD. This is about the adoption of different names = the adoption of a different identity- but it always catches up to them. I saw that the echo could represent their own realization coming through, the woman who strips her flowered dress off as drugs 'transforms' her into someone one different. Yet, we all, "wanna see some fireworks in this life".
