Interactive experiences like this inspire the public to care more about the fish and its habitat, according to Bridget Coughlin, president and CEO of the Shedd Aquarium.

This connection between humans experiencing wild animals and being inspired to conserve is the driving force behind the aquarium's new \$500 million project, an eight-year vision called the Centennial Commitment.

"The commitment is about the empathy gap between humans and nature, and that is one of the underpinnings of our biodiversity crisis," Coughlin said. "People will not save what they have no connection to." Despite the pandemic, which closed museums for a long stretch, the time is right for the aquarium to roll out new programs and execute the centennial commitment, Coughlin said.

"While the pandemic started, the climate crisis did not stop," she said. "We're living in an increased urbanized society with a growing nature gap. Then you overlay that with the fact that there is social and emotional healing from connecting to nature, which was needed before the pandemic. Now it is tenfold more needed.

Liz and Teri opened the meeting with a <u>Communications Update</u>, noting that technical issues have delayed the release of the new website. Those issues are related to corrupted files, and should be readily resolved.

Liz also noted that Kelly will pull social media content items from the newsletter, with a goal of adding at least one item per week. Kelly is unable to attend the Wed. meetings for the time being, but she, Teri, and Liz will meet monthly re Communications. The Feb. newsletter will focus on plastics.

Teri observed that some of the content in the Jan. newsletter, e.g., "Things to do around the house," are suggestions that could be used as an ongoing resource. Liz mentioned this content is from Jan. 2020 and is relevant to the month/time of year, but could always be updated. Liz invited all committee members to submit content or ideas for newsletters, social media posts, events, etc. Liz also mentioned that this content has also been submitted to the Winnetka EFC for possible inclusion in Village weekly email blasts.

Under <u>Community Engagement</u>, Ivy reported that her work for the Solar Guide relating to solar thermal, wind, and geothermal is ongoing. There was then a discussion of her idea to include specific information on existing solar panel installations in Winnetka. Teri suggested we might want to include interviews with some of the residents. Ivy observed that the Guide might also highlight "user experiences"

Liz suggested there may be sensitivity with regard to certain personal information (residential addresses, etc.), and Steve suggested we continue work on finalizing a first draft before considering whether to include interviews and related personal testimonies.

The group nonetheless agreed that the Guide would benefit from photos of actual installations, and Jess noted that future interviews could be featured on the website (if they didn't go directly into the Guide).

Jess suggested we might try to determine how many people would be interested in being interviewed, and Teri noted that 'nextdoor Winnetka' could be a useful vehicle for that. Liz felt this might be a future possibility, and Kelly may be able to help with it.

There was a consensus that any sort of personal information would not be published without a signed release.

Liz then asked if there were updates on the issue of plastic bag use, and Ivy wondered if the Village might take a position on that issue. Liz noted that the EFC might be willing to do that, but the Village Council is reluctant to take a stand on such issues. It's possible that content encouraging residents to use reusable bags could be included in the Village weekly email blasts.

On the topic of **Development and Partnerships**, there was not much to report, and there were

no new comments related to the Parkway. It was also noted that, given the COVID-19 situation, it's hard to spend energy on meeting and event planning outside the context of a comprehensive plan.

As for actual **Events** on the calendar:

Attendance has been climbing at GG Reads. *Braiding Sweetgrass* was very well attended, 46 people registered and 26 people participated. The next discussion will be *Sacred Cow*, on Mon. March 8 at 7pm.

The EFC meets tonight (Jan. 13) to begin addressing the parkway plantings issue. In that context, Matt Evans is preparing a Native Plants Guide that should be a valuable website resource. The EFC will have three more meetings on the topic in the coming months.

On Tues. Jan. 26, there will be an International Dark-Sky Association virtual presentation with Go Green Northfield.

On Wed. Feb. 3, there will be a Plastics Discussion co-hosted by local Go Green and other groups.

Under the heading of <u>New Business</u>, Craig reported that discussions related to hosting a pop-up restaurant facility along the lakefront seem to be going forward with a surprising amount of Park District support. There have also been unrelated comments with regard to plans for alternative uses for the old landfill site, which may become more relevant as the storm water management plan is implemented during the next 12 to 18 months. That plan would add an additional layer of earth to the top of the landfill as a result of reservoir excavations at various Park District locations.

Liz mentioned that the Jan. GGIL meeting, held the previous day, focused on electrification of fleets and efficient transportation, that the MMC (Metropolitan Mayors Caucus) recently published a number of EV-related resources:

Attendees: Liz, Scarlett, Teri, Mary, Steve, Jess, Ivy, Terry, Elisha, Luisa, Jeremy, and Craig

In accordance with the agenda, the meeting began with the 1) **Branch Reports**, and with the first branch a) of <u>Community Engagement</u>.

i): Ivy took the group through her draft of the Solar Guide. It was agreed that the Guide contains a trove of useful information. After the review, Teri offered to help with a further formatting the information. Craig offered to help as well, as did Jess and Liz as they are available. Final editing will be off-line, after the start of the New Year. It was also noted that the first few months of 2021 represent an especially good time to apply for Solar Renewable Energy Credits.

With regard to grocery bags (twig ii), Scarlett reported that the Trex contest is on hold due to the pandemic, and that the topic has been somewhat sidelined for the same reason. Liz mentioned she has a partial list of collection bin locations. Ivy noted that she has visited the Grand, Lakeside, and Mariano's, all of which now allow the customer to bring in (and fill) reusable cloth bags, but Elisha reported that Mariano's no longer offers paper bags as a store option.

With regard to iii), a ban on polystyrene packaging, Steve reported that he's currently looking at what other groups have done, and asked anyone with knowledge of such efforts to send him links to those resources.

- iv): Liz is in active discussions with the Village in regard to food scrap collections, and working with Rob Bahan on next steps.
- v): She also mentioned (and Jeremy later confirmed) that the proposal for a gas leaf blower ban is still in the planning stage. Jeremy and King are working on it.
- vi): Liz further noted that the topic of the circular economy is still of great interest (at least to her and Craig), but there's nothing yet of consequence to report.
- 2. Under <u>Communications and Education</u>, Teri mentioned that the images on the in-the-works website i) would change in the next several days, and that she is also looking forward to putting a fuller description of our initiatives on the site, which is viewable at https://developer.chicagocreativedirector.com/about/. She's very excited about both the content and the speed with which Steve Juliusson was able to get back into actively pushing the project forward.

There was also a brief discussion with regard to ii) letters and press releases Teri will use to get the word out about our activities. (It was noted that someone else will focus on social media outlets.)

C. Under <u>Development and Partnerships</u>, i) Liz mentioned that the new Library Director, Monica Dombrowski, is reportedly a fan of community partnerships,

Minutes

Attendees: Liz, Scarlett, Steve, Jess, Ivy, Terry, Elisha, and Craig

Jess began by opening the discussion of "branch" updates.

A. Under the <u>Community Engagement</u> branch, Ivy indicated that the Solar Guide is not yet finished, but she's expanded her activities to include talking with solar installation contractors. It seems no one is installing solar shingles yet. There are also no current incentives for property owners to use solar insulation (other than long term cost savings). She is connecting with Brian Keys to dig deeper into local utility issues. She will share her draft when it's ready.

Steve asked if she had found a good template for the Guide, and volunteered to help identify such a guide. There was then some discussion about whether the Guide should be published in paper form, digital form, or both. Liz commented that Naperville has a solar guide, and Steve offered to check on California and Arizona for possible template examples. Liz then commented that Naperville also has a broader goal of "improving solar market conditions" to make a more systemic impact.

- B. Under the <u>Communications and Education</u> branch, Teri proposed that sufficient material should be ready for the website developer (Steve Juliusson) to get the website up and running in a few weeks. Liz then described a proposed expansion process in which Teri will need additional input on content. Liz asked everyone to think about contributing content and ideas. Liz said she will work on creating a "Dear Willow" section (a la "Dear Abby"). Elisha then asked about the costs of this web development project. They have been minimal, since Steve J. and Teri have worked on a volunteer basis, and website hosting costs are small. Steve H. suggested that the finished website have links to the finished Solar Guide.
- C. Under the <u>Development and Partnerships</u> branch, the discussion turned to the second Tower Beach cleanup organized by the Sunrise group. Liz mentioned that Sunrise is interested in doing winter cleanups, which would be more land-based, perhaps near New Trier or along the Green Bay Trail. Liz also mentioned the potential to partner with Sunrise on a Monarch Butterfly habitat restoration project that might dovetail with the work at Tower Beach (given the prevalence of milkweed).

Ivy next reported that The Grand now allows use of cloth bags (largely as a result of Ivy's and Liz's work). Liz plans to speak with Scarlett (who had to drop off the call prior to this point) about a letter-writing campaign to push a ban on the use of plastic grocery bags.

**

With regard to the Green Bay Trail, Steve mentioned that he and Elisha and Craig are

working with Chuck Dowding to develop a proposal to be submitted to a design group connected to Northwestern University that will seek solutions to restoring the environmental integrity of the Winnetka section of the Trail.

D. Jess then asked if there were any initiatives that should be added to the Permeable Paver Lot. The reusable grocery bag issue was mentioned, as was the collection of food scraps. Steve H. offered to take on the issue of a Styrofoam packaging ban (under Community Engagement). Liz said a Regional Climate Action Plan is being worked on and expected to be released before the end of the year.

As to other new initiatives, the group discussed a ban on gas-powered leaf blowers, and the concept of a "circular economy." Liz also mentioned the potential for a program called the Greenest Region Compact which would share the cost of hiring an intern for a year to serve in an environmental coordinating capacity, and that Chris Rintz's requested that a Village staff person investigate this possibility.

Attendees: Liz, Teri, Steve, Jess, Luisa, Ivy, Terry, Elisha, and Craig

A. Liz opened the meeting by suggesting a process for further developing the GGW structure and operational focus. Jess then gave an overview of the work to date that's been captured in our PowerPoint presentation. Steve mentioned that the process provides an opportunity to introduce friends and neighbors to our various initiatives, and encourage their involvement. Luisa then described how the Sunrise group has created initiative-specific Action Leagues, and the fact that members have specific "jobs" in addition to being involved in unrelated Actions. Jess mentioned that the survey ended up being unintentionally anonymous and requested that respondents email her or indicate in the chat whether there are branches they want to lead or support.

- B. Teri walked the group through the current status of the website, including the organizational structure of the content and the labels used to identify the content groups. She also took a large number of photos that may be relevant, and mentioned that Steve Juliusson has written a large amount of text that would be useful in the "how-to" content sections. Steve (H.) then made the comment that it would also be useful to have downloadable PDF versions of this sort of 'how to' information available on the website. There was a discussion around whether such info should be sorted under "FAQs" or "Education". Teri proposed that such material could be available via links to more than one location. Liz mentioned that the Village and Environmental and Forestry Commission are working to make similar information available on its website.
- C. The discussion then turned to the potential to use the tree metaphor not just as the background image for the Home page, but as an overall organizational theme (branches, roots, etc.) with the use of appropriate photos. Ivy commented that photos are also a good way to illustrate what we're doing in terms of our various initiatives. Luisa mentioned that the

Sunrise group uses a Google photo album. Jess then asked if there were additional initiatives we should list.

D. Ivy described some of her progress on the Solar Guide initiative, and invited Teri to work with her on that project. Luisa volunteered support from members of the Sunrise group as well. Jess suggested that we should coordinate and collaborate with Sunrise on this guide, and asked Ivy to share the current version with them. Luisa then suggested that one inducement to homeowners might be to point out what sort of "average savings" are available in terms of reduced utility costs. Liz mentioned this Solar Guide is needed on the Village website as well.

E. Luisa gave an update on the Tower Rd. Beach cleanup, and mentioned that Sunrise uses the "Mobilize" platform to register volunteers. Luisa and Teri then showed photos they'd taken on cleanup day. There was a brief discussion of additional cleanup project opportunities (Skokie Lagoons, Green Bay Trail, etc.), and Liz pointed out that the Village is currently in fiscal budgeting mode, and doesn't have much bandwidth to consider or approve other cleanup sites. The fact that Styrofoam beads are particularly hard to collect was also noted in the context of the beach cleanup. Luisa mentioned that a second cleanup event at Tower beach is tentatively scheduled for Sat. Nov. 14.

F. At this point people had started to drop off the call due to time limitations, but Liz spoke about her personal interest in doing something in terms of a "circular economy" initiative, especially in light of the fact that the Village's Comprehensive Plan process is officially on hold until in-person gatherings can happen again. Craig expressed an interest in that topic, and suggested that the ABOUT tag might be labeled "OVERSTORY" as a way to extend the tree metaphor. He also suggested that reusable cloth carrying bags might be used for beach cleanup rather than buckets, and that different bags could be provided for different types of refuse...and also that the bags might display the GGW logo and website address. Ivy then volunteered to contact the Grand to revisit their ban on the use of reusable cloth carrying bags. Liz mentioned branded reusable bags have been offered previously and suggested it's a good time to revisit making them available to the community; if we offer them at Beach cleanups, then people may take them to the store when they go.

In the interest of full disclosure, when Craig mentioned the "OVERSTORY" idea to his wife after the end of the meeting, her comment was, "I hate to burst your bubble, but when I'm trying to find something on a website, I don't want to think, I just want to find what I'm looking for. (This was in spite of her loving the Richard Powers book.)

- A. The meeting unofficially began with a brief discussion of the Go Green Illinois Schools meeting that happened the day prior, which included two presentations by representatives of the Environmental Education Association of Illinois and focused on outdoor learning spaces in general and Project Learning Tree resources specifically.
- B. The meeting then turned to the main agenda, which was continued discussion of GGW structure, organization, and operational focus. Jessica presented a new "Family Tree" (Org Chart) reflecting the structure below and said, ideally, each "Branch" will have someone leading it, as well as other members supporting it (like 'Twigs' or 'Leaves'). Pat suggested the Mission and Vision statements be included with the Family Tree to show what we are always striving for. Liz suggested the Mission and Vision statements are both foundational and aspirational and reflect the basis of our work, as well as goals to reach.
 - a. Exec/Officers/Leadership
 - b. Three Branches/functions
 - i. Communications & Education (education and events)
 - ii. Community Initiatives (liaison with other govt bodies and GRC2 issues)
 - iii. Development & Partnerships (fundraising, partnerships/collaborations)
 - Partnerships to explore Sunrise, Seven Generations Ahead, SCARCE, Illinois Food Scrap Coalition, Winnetka Park District, Smallgood (WCC advertising partner), Friends of the Green Bay Trail, Friends of the Chicago River, Alliance for the Great Lakes, Lakota Group (Winnetka Futures consultant), Rotary (Winnetka-Northfield?)
- C. Ivy wondered where she might fit in, as she is interested in motivating action on the individual level, rather than the community/govt level.
 - a. This led to a discussion of issues and projects that cut across all three Branches

- of work and reassurance that no one will be asked to work on or lead a project or issue they do not want to we want people to be able to work "excellently" (Steve's word) and not to be spread too thin.
- b. For example, although Ivy is interested in energy in general, she does not want to be the point person for every energy-related program or issue that we may want to pursue. Her particular interests are educating around solar panels and electric vehicles, so she may take the lead within GGW on creating a Solar Panel Guide and/or EV Guide, both of which would fall within the Education and Community Initiatives Branches easily, and which also could cross into Development & Partnerships if there are opportunities to partner with other groups on presentations, webinars, grants, etc.
- c. Liz mentioned she just connected with a Winnetka resident who installed solar panels on his roof, who has agreed to talk to us about the process so that we can incorporate it into any Guide created. Steve suggested connecting with Faith In Place, which may also have resources to share. Liz will follow-up with Ivy re the Solar Panel Guide.
- D. Luisa Struck reported on Sunrise Northshore. The Sunrise Movement is a national movement aimed at young people to work toward a just, equitable, and sustainable future. The Movement supports passage of the Green New Deal and supports and endorses political candidates.
 - a. Luisa co-founded Sunrise North Shore (formerly Sunrise Wilmette) with Polly Frazen. They are juniors at New Trier. They are not affiliated with the NT Environmental Club, nor do they collaborate much with them, but there is overlap in membership. The North Shore hub is completely youth-led; there are no adults involved. Luisa and Polly like it that way and the freedom and flexibility that allows them. They did not join an existing organization for that reason as well. Their group is mostly high school students, with some middle school and college students as well.
 - b. They are organizing their hub and filling roles. They are working with the NT Young Democrats club on some actions in support of specific political candidates.
 - c. Sunrise North Shore started a petition requesting that NT stop using single-use plastics in its cafeteria. That petition has garnered more than 600 signatures. There has been no official word from NT.
 - d. Sunrise North Shore is also planning a beach clean up in Winnetka, which looks like it will be Sat. Oct. 3. It looks like the Park District and Go Green Winnetka will partner on this event. Details tbd.
 - e. Liz reminded everyone that, as a 501(c)(3) non-profit, Go Green Winnetka is prohibited from endorsing any political candidate and does not want to do anything to be perceived as a partisan group.
- E. Liz reported on a few miscellaneous items.
 - a. She is working with Steve Juliusson on the website.

- b. Teri Cross let Liz know after the last meeting that she is interested in the communications side of things. She is going to work with Liz and Steve on the website.
- c. It is possible the Environmental and Forestry Commission will have a special meeting during the week of Sept. 21 to discuss the Downtown Master Plan. Whenever that meeting happens, the public are welcome to attend and provide comment.
- d. The next Go Green Reads book discussion will be Monday, Sept. 21 from 6:30 7:30. The Overstory, by Richard Powers, will be discussed.
- F. Jess opened the meeting to new business/issues.
 - a. Elisha reminded everyone to submit photos to the Friends of the Green Bay Trail Photo Contest by Sept. 30 and then to vote on the submissions!
 - b. Liz forgot to mention but would like folks to know we really need help posting info re issues and events on social media. If anyone would like to step onto that side of communications, let us know. Consider this a social media ambassador role.

A. The meeting unofficially began with a discussion of the collection of plastic packaging materials for Trex Decking. Jess spoke about the Mission and Target Focus for the group, and the desire to create a structure for the meetings that would help guarantee open discussions, and also allow the group to execute decisions after the meetings are over. She referred to the five categories we've decided to focus on from the GRC2 document, and that we might think in terms of an overarching structure based on "Finance and Fundraising, "Education and Outreach", and "Community Initiatives".

Elisha then asked about 501(c)3 governance requirements. Steve noted the requirements are consistent with the proposed structure. There was then a discussion about whether board members should also be heads of committees. The consensus seemed to be that this should not be necessary.

Liz mentioned that the idea for the five-category framework came from the GGW Deerfield group, and Teri raised the issue of where we should put the main focus of our own activities. Jess and Liz suggested we come back to that question after deciding who should lead each activity area. Jess used the example of the Comprehensive Plan, and how we might determine a coordinator for that activity. Elisha wondered, if no one is interested in taking on a particular issue, would it be OK to postpone the activity? Liz responded that there is no intention to promote an agenda item that has no sponsor.

Steve then wondered about closing out 'old business', and volunteered to help Liz

push open issues to a conclusion. Jess suggested that we regularly leave time at the end of each meeting to discuss "other" topics and ideas.

In this context, Liz brought up the issue of 'trash on the beach', and also noted that John Peterson, a former Park District Board Member, is now the Executive Director of the Park District. As a result, the taxing body now seems more open to new thinking.

She also noted that the schools have adopted a strategy of holding some classes outdoors, and Jess observed that the schools need more information on managing indoor air quality during this difficult time.

Elisha then put in a plug for the Friends of the Green Bay Trail Photo Contest, and Scarlett expressed concern that trees which do not seem to be diseased are nevertheless being cut down. Joan suggested this might be the result of the installation of 5G network towers, and the fact that tall trees can interfere with reception. It was noted that Jim Stier, the Village Forester, can be contacted at JStier@Winnetka.org, and that Andrew Lueck is the assistant Forester.

Teri also wondered about solar panel installation, and the Village's role in that process. Liz mentioned that, since the signing of the GRC2 agenda, it's easier than in the past, but the Village has not been pro-active in letting people know this. She suggested that if a resident works with a competent solar panel contractor, the contractor can deal with the Village.

The meeting ended with a brief discussion of the potential to identify a GGW person to be a liaison with each Village taxing body, and also to list contact information for Village staff on a government resource page on the GGW website.

The next meeting is scheduled for Sept. 16.

nearby towns including Wilmette, Northbrook, Park Ridge, Evanston, and Deerfield. Highlights include: a question-posting feature on the Wilmette site; Northbrook blog posts that discuss the group's activities; the Park Ridge site has no separate Home page, but features a discussion of natural lawn care, posts monthly agendas, and has an e-newsletter and profiles of "Changemakers"; the website for Citizens of a Greener Evanston is clean and simple, covers a multitude of topics, and lists many events on their calendar; the Deerfield site hosts a significant amount of "how-to" information, and the group seems focused on switching the town to renewable energy.

The presentation was followed by a brief discussion of the Terracycle feature on the Northbrook site, and the Changemaker profiles offered by Park Ridge. It was suggested that other GGW members visit the sites and share additional reactions.

Ivy then volunteered to update an Events calendar on the Winnetka site. Mary noted that a Google calendar might make the task easier than relying on the calendar feature provided with the website software.

E. At exactly 12:30, Jessica began a discussion of proposed priorities and initiatives. She noted that the group's purpose hasn't changed year to year, but the current focus on a Comprehensive Plan for the Village presents a special opportunity. She then presented the ranking preferences of those who had responded to the list of issues circulated on Tuesday.

During the discussion of those results, Steve suggested the Comprehensive Plan should be viewed as an actual short-term initiative. Pat suggested that private residences and the surrounding yards should not be left out of consideration, and Steve noted they can be treated as elements covered by the term "habitat".

Jess then proposed that the various initiatives be organized under two separate headings – "What" and "How". The What would include: "Alternative Transportation"; "Alternative Energy"; "Waste Reduction"; "Habitat Restoration"; and "Water Preservation and Restoration". The How would cover: "Communication and Outreach"; and "Community Initiatives".

This was followed by a short discussion of the issue of refrigerants (in the context of air conditioning's impact on GHG emissions), and how the term "resiliency" works at the Mission Statement level. It was in this context that a suggestion was made to create a Glossary (for the website?) that would clarify the group's usage terms such as "resiliency" and "mitigation".

Scarlett then suggested we should look for ways to further student engagement as a means to communicate through them to local families. There was then a brief discussion of how our outreach activities might be made more effective. Craig suggested we consult with the Caucus Communications Committee, which recently had some success in improving the response rate to the annual Village Survey.

Ivy then made the point that in order to effectively implement an outreach strategy (or any other initiatives), we need to be able to measure the result. There was general agreement around this issue, and Liz noted that in many cases it will require data from the Village, and that the Village understands this is an issue. Teri then suggested that it would also be worthwhile to collect such information directly from the residents, perhaps with some sort of survey tool. Scarlett proposed that part of the outreach activity might include a feature on the website that helps residents set personal green goals.

F. The meeting adjourned following a statement from Pat in appreciation for all of Liz's hard work.

The next meeting is scheduled for August 19.

We had a couple of new people at this month's meeting, so we did introductions. It was interesting to hear everyone's background and how they connected with Go Green Winnetka.

- Peter Straub recent college grad; Winnetka schools alum; living in the city but wants to help GGWinnetka; HW School/neighbors connected Peter and Liz; this Peter's first meeting with us
- Margaret Goss real estate agent; met Liz through Chamber of Commerce monthly lunches; regular GGWinnetka lunch attendee
- Joan Zietlow longtime Winnetka resident; functional health specialist; learned of Go
 Green Winnetka through the Winnetka Talk and came to our last meeting
- Craig Witty longtime Winnetka resident and defender of the Green Bay Trail; Elisha connected Craig and Liz a few weeks ago by email, in part specifically to extend Friend of the Green Bay Trail's work into Winnetka; this is Craig's first meeting with us

GGW is co-hosting a movie screening of The Story of Stuff with the League of Women Voters of Winnetka-Northfield-Kenilworth and the Go Green groups in Northfield and Kenilworth on Thurs. Nov. 21 at 7pm at the Winnetka Congregational Church. GGW will continue to partner with the LWV on movie screenings and other events.

The Consultant who will lead the process of creating a new Comprehensive Plan for the Village will hopefully be chosen by the end of October. GGW input will be needed. Liz will participate in the conversation as part of the Environmental and Forestry Commission and will need others to be the voice of Go Green Winnetka.

Some issues to think about/advocate for are - the Green Bay Trail, walkability of the Village, One Winnetka (privately owned) and Post Office site (publicly owned (by the Village)), pesticides, renewable energy, Winnetka's power plant/waste to energy, water, food scraps, sustainable development.

Liz mentioned a recent Illinois Supreme Court decision paves the way for incentives for installing solar panels available under the Future Energy Jobs Act, which were previously available to ComEd customers only, to also be available to municipal customers like Winnetka (whose electricity is provide by IMEA, the Illinois Municipal Energy Association). Village staff anticipate increased solar installations in Winnetka in the coming months as a result of this. The Village Council recently considered net metering rates in the Village.

Everyone is invited to contact the Village Council regarding sustainability and other issues important to the Village. Attend Council meetings and make public comment and email the Council en masse at contactcouncil@winnetka.org.

A new Village Public Works Analyst has been hired and is the EFC's new staff liaison. He has a background and an interest in environmental issues and seems eager to work.

Skokie School teachers are incorporating units regarding their students and the natural world. Some students will focus on the school level, some on the Village level, and some on a national or global level. The students focusing on the Village level will hopefully have input into the Comprehensive Plan - what do they want the Village to look like in 20 - 30 years (when they move back)?

New-ish GGW members Rebecca Knohl and Peter Straub want to extend GGW's reach to young people/students.

GGNF wants to partner with GGW on a series of programs at the library, alternating between the branches. GGW is excited about this partnership. GGNF is planning to host the first event

in the spring of 2020 at the Northfield branch, which may focus on water and include a watershed model of the LWV. Then GGW will plan an event at the Winnetka branch in the fall. Planning events around (the theme of) America Recycles Day on Nov. 15 is always an option.
