

## Web Programming Workshop

Assignment 2 - **DUE BY THE START OF CLASS FRIDAY OCT. 27**

### **Prompt:**

- Find an interesting way to organize **at least 10 pieces of information** using either Flexbox ("display: flex;") or CSS Grid ("display: grid;").
  - I've created two demos for you to check out! Here's one that uses [flexbox](#), and one that uses [CSS grid](#). (Download the code for the demos [here](#)!)
- The links you collect are up to you, but here are some examples/ideas:
  - 10 Wikipedia articles (you could also include article titles, images, descriptions, etc.)
  - 10 Google searches
  - 10 pictures of dogs
  - 10 weather forecasts for different zip codes
  - 10 news articles on a topic
  - 10 Instagram accounts you enjoy
  - 10 blog posts
  - 10 memes
  - 10 fonts
  - 10 of your own projects (like a portfolio! If you don't have 10, you can always make some up as placeholders)
- This doesn't have to be complicated! Just make something interesting and try your best to make the layout reflect the content in some way. Here are some things to think about:
  - Color (gradients are fun!)
  - Scale (font size, padding, etc.)
  - Typeface (try using a [custom font](#) if you haven't already!)
  - Angle/Orientation (is your site vertical or horizontal? Is it rotated? If you haven't tried "[transform: rotate\( deg\)](#)" you could do that!)
  - Spacing (is everything squished together or far apart?)
  - Interaction (how does your site promote interaction?)
- Upload your finished .html to your student folder in the class Drive.
  - If you use any external files in your story, upload those images as well to your folder.
