Lesson 4: Love One Another

Ages 10-13

Goals

Students will understand how to love one another by exploring biblical teachings and practical ways to apply this principle in their daily lives.

Welcome Time

- Greet students as they arrive.
- Provide name tags or stickers to foster a sense of belonging.
- Encourage students to share one kind thing they've done for someone else recently.

- Sing songs that emphasize love and kindness, such as:
 - o "Jesus Loves Me""Love One Another"

Lesson

Opening Activities

- **Icebreaker**: Play "Love Charades," where students act out ways to show love without speaking.
- **Discussion Starter**: Ask, "What does love mean to you?" and write their responses on the board.

Memory Verse

Matthew 22:39: "Love your neighbor as yourself."

Bible Story

- **Text**: 1 John 3:10-18
- Reading: Read the passage aloud, emphasizing key themes like love in action and selflessness.
- Visual Aid: Show a video that reinforces the story (e.g., https://voutu.be/UvV8rlGMMgw?si=pCU0BNn1a9lCaNHI).

Discussion Questions

- 1. How are children of God known?
- 2. What is the greatest commandment that we received from the beginning?
- 3. How were Samaritans ranked in society at that time?
- 4. What signifies that we have passed from death to life?
- 5. Describe murderers according to this text. What's the eternal reward for murderers?
- 6. Describe Jesus' kind of love that we should imitate.
- 7. What should we do if we have extra items in our possessions?
- 8. What kind of love should we show?

Gospel Point

- Love is action, not just words. Jesus' love is sacrificial and selfless, and we're called to emulate that love.
- Encourage reflection on how students can practice love this week.

Activity

- **Activity**: Create a "Kindness Chain" where each student writes one loving act on a strip of paper. Link them to form a chain representing collective love.
- **Visual Aid**: Use a poster or slideshow showing real-life examples of people demonstrating love (e.g., helping the homeless, comforting a friend).

Craft

• **Heart Collage**: Provide colored paper, scissors, glue, and markers for students to create a collage of hearts, each labeled with ways to show love.

Gospel Points

- 1. **God is Love:** God's nature is love, and He created us to live in that love.
- 2. **Jesus Demonstrates Perfect Love:** Jesus' sacrificial love on the cross shows us how to love selflessly.
- 3. **Love is an Action:** True love is not just words but actions that reflect kindness, generosity, and care for others.
- 4. **We Reflect God's Love:** By loving others, we reflect God's character and share His light with the world.
