

Kenosha Unified Athletics – Hall of Fame Inductee – Class of 1995

Sue Blonshine Reindl – 1984

The name Sue Blonshine is not unfamiliar to Hall of Fame attendees. She was one of four scholar-athletes honored at the inaugural Hall of Fame Banquet in 1984. Her biography from the program read, “Deeply involved in sports in the three years at Bradford, Sue has earned the admiration of coaches, athletes, and friends alike as a result of her determination in seeking athletic excellence in cross country, basketball and track... a six letter winner and co-captain and MVP award winner for the cross country and track teams... holder of Bradford girls’ hurdle and long jump records and state qualifier in those events as a member of the track team... and an excellent team player in basketball.”

“Sue’s involvement in three sports requires much personal discipline to also accommodate playing the viola in the orchestra, and participating in her church youth group activities. Her coaches stated that she is an excellent example of what ‘Positively Bradford’ is all about and she serves as a ‘model of excellence’ for others.”

During her freshman year at the University of Wisconsin-Stout, Sue participated on the track team and set a school record in the indoor hurdles. She placed second in the hurdles at the Conference Indoor Meet, won the 100 meters at the Outdoor Conference Meet, and qualified for the National Track Meet. Sue returned to Kenosha and is presently a homemaker and the proud parent of a two year old daughter.

With those accolades, it is no wonder Sue was selected to be honored by the Foundation at the first banquet, and now 11 years later, to be inducted into the Hall of Fame.
