Tragic Mental Landscapes

DUE: Monday, Oct. 5

In the plays of *Oedipus* and *Medea*, and the novel *Things Fall Apart*, the main characters undergo extreme psychological change. Oedipus, for example, goes from blindness to enlightenment—discovering his true identity but losing his eyesight and everything he holds dear.

Create a psychological landscape for **two** of the characters listed below using writing, images, symbols, drawings, pictures, collage, etc.

What does the character's mind look like? Sound like? You may use any media you find in the classroom or at home. Be sure to include all angles of your character's identity, what he/she knows and what he/she doesn't. Consider your character's influences, motivation, negative and positive traits, thoughts, important images and symbols, beliefs, feelings, value and perceptions of other. Your landscape should present a complete picture of your character's identity!
