Staff understand how the school’s locality could be a risk factor in children being subject to radicalisation or extremism.	In identifying radicalisation and/or extremist views we also take into account the location and community context of our school being rural and very white majority.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Staff and governors are aware that given the make-up of our school’s community with little or no multi-culturalism that there could be low levels of tolerance for other cultures and faiths due to lack of exposure to this through rural isolation. Staff and governors therefore understand the need to be aware of potentially vulnerable families and children who become a target for extremist views. 	
Know how to report concerns regarding radicalisation and extremism.	The school has identified a Prevent Lead and supporting Governor.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All staff know who the Prevent Lead is and that this person acts as a source of advice and support. All staff know what to look out for and how and when to report any concerns about this. 	All staff
