Cardinal Basketball Code of Conduct 84 X 50

The following is an outline of expectations of Cardinal Basketball Players. This list is extensive, but it is neither all-inclusive or unreasonable. Our players adhere to a high standard of behavior because it is an honor to wear the Cardinal Basketball jersey.

Home

- 1. Respect parents every day. Tell parents that you love them at least once a day.
- 2. No drinking, smoking, or drug use. Avoid events where alcohol might be present. Why put yourself in that situation?
- 3. Risky physical behaviors, such as snowboarding or skiing, should be avoided during season.
- 4. Life cannot be lived staring at a screen. Put down your digital devices and interact with people.

School

- 1. Respect teachers.
- 2. Focus on the grades. This is what will get you someplace in life.
- 3. Model good behavior for other students be a role model!
- 4. Complete your homework.
- 5. Weight training is important for overall physical fitness. Basketball lifting should be with lower weights and higher reps to maximize flexibility and explosion.
- 6. Attend school. Academics determine your future. You must be in attendance all day to play basketball.

Practice

- 1. All players will meet for Chalkboard time promptly at 3:25 in the team room.
- 2. Captains and/or coaches will be notified prior to practice of absences or tardies. Coaches will later discuss with the player whether it is excused or unexcused.
- 3. Reversible practice jerseys must be worn for all practices.
- 4. Full attention will be granted to the coach following a whistle. This is out of respect for the coaches.
- 5. Maximum effort is required during drills.

- 8. Players will practice to win games.
- 9. Appropriate language will be used at all times. Inappropriate language is to be saved for your mother at home. She wants to hear that more than we do.
- 10. Players are to be at practice even when injured.
- 11. Players are to be at practice even if ineligible.
- 12. Some players may be required to complete homework during practice time, but will be required to make up for missed practice time.
- 13. Everything we do matters and prepares us for the big show.
- 14. PrACTice like a Champion each day.

Game Day

- 1. Dress up. Look classy be classy.
- 2. Being on time involves arriving early to get prepared so that everything goes smoothly.
- 3. Uniform will be on a hangar refer to classy.
- 4. Bus rides will be quiet on way to a game for focus on the task.
- 5. Varsity will ride in front, JV in back.

- 3. Players must raise hands toward the team bench when a foul is called on them to alert the bench of the call.
- 4. Only captains may address officials and in doing this they must address the ref as "sir" or "mam."
- 5. All interactions with teammates will be respectful.
- 6. Play hard until the whistle allow the referees to call the game.
- 7. Play defense each possession as if the current possession could win the game.
- 8. Make each and every offensive possession count.

Timeouts

- 1. Bench players will stand to attention during each timeout. On full timeouts the players in the game will sit with the bench players surrounding them.
- 2. Bench players will get and hand water and towels to players coming off the court.
- 3. Only the coach talks during a timeout players will speak when called upon by the coaches.
