You have 72 hours to check in with probation. Your Probation Officer will play a key role in your reentry. It is important to start out on a good foot. Bring any certificates that you earned during your incarceration and a mapped out plan of your goals.

- ☐ Visit DMV to square away any Identification or License obligations

2. Visit Social Services

- ☐ Check in to find out what benefits or vouchers you can qualify for
- ☐ Seek assistance if struggling with substance abuse issues
- ☐ Connect with mental health services if needed

3. Visit a Financial Institution

- ☐ Open a Savings & Checking account
- ☐ Find out the status of your Credit
- ☐ Unload your ReleasePay Card into an account
- ☐ Understand and address any outstanding financial obligations

4. Find a Primary Care Physician

- ☐ Schedule a medical check-up and address any immediate health concerns
- ☐ Explore healthcare options, like Medicaid or community health

5. Contact Your Employer

- ☐ If you have a job lined up, contact your employer updating them on your release
- ☐ Contact your local Career Center for employment, résumé, or interview assistance

It is important to set SMART ([Specific](#), [Measurable](#), [Realistic](#), [Timely](#)) goals for when you return home. Remember that some tasks like getting your license might take longer than you anticipate, and you may need to readjust your goals.

In your Release Packet, you should receive a Certificate of Incarceration. If you present this to the Clerk of your Court, it should take the interest off of the fines. This **does not** work for restitution. If you did not receive a Certificate of Incarceration, write the headquarters of DOC in Richmond to receive one.

Further Your Education for Free

G3 Bill: This bill provides free community colleges courses for in demand trades in the state of Virginia for those living 400% below the poverty line (a family of four would be \$100,000). For those don't meet the income requirement there is also the Fast Forward program to help with funding. Targeted careers are Healthcare, Information Technology, Manufacturing and Skilled Trades, Early Childhood Education, and Public Safety.

Restoration of Rights: Incarceration results in the loss of your civil right to vote and your right to carry a firearm. Every state has different policies to get your rights restored. In Virginia for your civil rights you can visit the website or call. You must complete probation and the process takes 1-3 months. For your gun rights If you were convicted in Virginia Circuit Court, you must petition the circuit court in the jurisdiction where you reside to regain state firearms privileges. For out-of-state or federal felony convictions, you must petition the court of conviction to regain firearm privileges.

Relevant Employment Policies

Ban The Box: This is a fair chance hiring policy that removes the check-box on job applications asking if the person has previously had a felony conviction. It does not prevent the employer from asking about the felony during the interview. Federal agencies and contractors are prohibited from asking about criminal history until after a conditional job offer has been made.

Work Opportunity Tax Credit: This is a tax write off for employers who hire individuals with significant barriers to employment. Eligible participants include people with felonies, veterans, TANF recipients, SNAP recipients, SSI recipients, and summer youth employees. The employer can receive \$1,200-\$9,600 per person they hire deducted from their taxes. Employers must file within 28 days of hiring the candidate.

Federal Bonding Program: This is free insurance for employers who hire people with previous criminal convictions. Employers can be issued bonds in increments of \$5000 that protect them in cases of Larceny, Embezzlement, Forgery and Theft (L.E.F.T.) The employer simply needs to call the bonding coordinator to activate their bond. These bonds last for 6-months and then the employer can choose to purchase additional bonds for a reduced rate.
