- Dr. Wagle was present at our meeting with some updates
 - The Board approved our new playground plan at their meeting last night! He thanked the PTA for their help in financing this big project.
 - o The Board is working on the Bond process for a large addition to the High School
 - Dr. Wagle discussed the pending AEA legislation and the potential impacts it could have on PVCSD. He also informed guests that there is a safety bill pending that would allow school staff to carry weapons on school grounds. He encouraged guests to be in contact with their local legislators.
 - Lastly, he spoke with guests about Supplemental State Aid (SSA) which is money
 we get from the State each year for us to budget for next year. We are currently
 waiting for the state for that percentage.
 - In summary, Dr. Wagle reminded attendees that these are OUR kids and we must be informed and involved in the legislative process so that decisions in Des Moines are reflective of your views and we can make sure lowa kids are getting the very best education possible.
