We want our pupils to have

- an understanding of how citizens can influence decision-making through the democratic process
- an understanding that the freedom to hold other faiths and beliefs is protected in law
- an acceptance that people having different faiths or beliefs to oneself (or having none) should be accepted and tolerated, and should not be the cause of prejudicial or discriminatory behaviour
- an understanding of the importance of identifying and combating discrimination

Included in parts of the curriculum - appropriate for the age of our pupils information on the strengths, advantages and disadvantages of democracy, and how democracy and the law works in Britain, in contrast to other forms of government in other countries.

All pupils within the school will have a voice that is listened to, and demonstrate how democracy works by actively promoting democratic processes such as a school council which is timetabled and meets weekly and where members are voted for, by the pupils.

When there are general or local elections hold school mock elections to promote fundamental British values and provide pupils with the opportunity to learn how to argue and defend points of view.

Consider the role of extra-curricular activity, including any run directly by pupils, in promoting fundamental British values.

- To provide breadth and balance in the curriculum.
- To support children's progress and development.
- To promote learning through investigation.
- To use assessment, recording and reporting to promote continuity of learning.
- To support children and their families, including special needs as stated in the SEN policy.
- To ensure a welcoming and inclusive environment.
- To work in partnership with parents/carers and local agencies.
- To have an appropriate range of policies and procedures which support learning.
- Child protection will be a priority as stated in our policy.
- To provide recordings of any policies for visually impaired parents/carers.
- To display children's work including photographs of activities as an ongoing record of development.
- To provide support and encouragement for staff involved with student learning.
