Transfer Student Advising Prep Steps

Prepare a list of classes for Advising Week by following the steps below.

1. Know what you've completed:

Unofficial Transcript: In your Student Portal on the 'My Academics' tab identify courses completed, credits transferred in.

2. Have an understanding of what you need:

- a. Students with more than 24 credits can enroll in LEAD301 instead of 101, but we recommend 101 to be in the class with other first year students
- b. Students with more than 24 credits can take LEAD311 but aren't required to
- c. If you received an AA/AS as a dual enrollment student, you should register for LEAD101, and are required to take the Professional Pathways sequence of LEAD111, LEAD112, and LEAD211.
- d. Students with an AA/AS only have to complete LEAD301 no other LEAD requirements such as Inquiries or CoreExploration are required.

Core Requirements:

- LEAD Seminar: LEAD 101 (First Year Students) or 301 (Transfer Students)
- Professional Pathways: LEAD111 (First Year Fall), LEAD112 (First Year Spring), LEAD211 (by end of Jr Year)
- <u>Core Knowledge and Methods:</u> LEAD exploration or an inquiry

• <u>Language Study:</u> Encouraged to complete during year one. Language course at 102/110 or higher. AP scores of 3. 4, or 5 on a foreign language exam fulfill this requirement.

3. Major Requirements:

- Degree checklists: Major/Minor Requirements
 - Undecided Major? (Remember to select a major before completing 55 credits)
 - Identify topics that interest you (Sometimes it helps to think about your strengths and weaknesses)
 - Select an entry level course with a number 100 200

This course should be a major requirement and an Exploration or Inquiry requirement. Example: PSYCH 101, ECON 102

• Write down a few classes you are interested in taking, making sure the courses do not conflict with each other. (Using the <u>Schedule Planner Matrix</u> form will help ensure there are no conflicts).

4. Create a list of possible courses for next semester:

Use the table below to create a list of possible courses you can take next semester and bring these options to your advising meeting. Go to 'Course Search' in your Student Portal to find classes.

- Take no more than 2 classes back-to-back, unless you cannot avoid it. Be sure classes do not overlap.
- All first year students with less than 24 credits, must successfully complete LEAD111 and LEAD112. LEAD211 should be completed by the end of Junior year. A student who started SMCM in the fall normally takes LEAD111 in Fall, LEAD112 in Spring of their first year and thenLEAD211 during their second year.
