Interdisciplinary Studies: Creativity and Culture

- AUART 231 and AUART 271 may count towards the 6 credit units of 100-level Creative Practice; first year students in the C& C major may register in these courses.

- Students graduating in Spring 2025 are recommended to take AUENG 441 to fulfill their AUSSC 400 requirement; see poster. Alternatively, directed studies in the field of politics, religion, philosophy, or history may be approved on a case-by-case basis.
- Any 300-level topics course in AUHIS, AUPHI, AUPOL, or AUREL may fulfill the AUIDS 370 requirement.
- AUENG courses at the 200 level or above can count towards the 15-18 credits in the 200-level or higher EGS course requirement.

Psychology and Mental Health & Psychology (Before Fall 2021)

- All students in Psychology and Mental Health are required to complete a co-curricular certificate; choose at least one of the following:
 - Community Engagement and Service-Learning certificate This embedded certificate is completed by fulfilling 3 credits in a CSL-designated course (AUCSL 100, 360, 480) and 12 credits from approved courses that have a CSL component (must satisfactorily meet the CSL requirements of each course.)
 Progress towards the CESL can be tracked in your Academic Requirement report. Courses can count towards the certificate as well as other academic requirements.
 - Mental Health First Aid course 9-20 hours of instruction; online and in-person training available. Cost varies (\$175- 290.) The Mental Health First Aid website provides a great overview of the training available.
 - Brain Story certification (required for Brain and Behaviour Stream) (<u>Alberta Family Wellness Initiative</u>) 19 modules (self-paced, online.) This certification is offered free of charge.
- In the Mental health and Well-being stream, the requirement, 12 credits from AUSOC 101, AUSOC 105, AUSSC 300, and AUPSY 342 may be met by completing:

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE

***To graduate with a BSc degree, 66 of your 120 credits need to be science credits. As such, we recommend that at least 50% of the classes you take each year are science courses.

Integrative Biology

- Students participating in the Costa Rica field studies program will need to enroll in the Fall 2024 AUIDS 301 section with Stephen Cruikshank.
- If you are entering your second year, be sure to enrol in all of the 200-level requirements for your program (AUBIO 260, AUBIO 253, AUBIO 230, AUSTA 215, and AUCHE 250).
 Not taking all of these courses in your second year will make it challenging for you to take the required courses you need for your major in subsequent years.
- If you are entering your third year and did not take AUCHE 250 last year, approval has been granted to allow AUCHE 250 and AUBIO 380 to be taken as co-requisites. Please contact augsas@ualberta.ca for assistance enrolling in AUBIO 380.
- Students should consider taking a 400-level AUBIO course in their third year to help ensure they fulfill their 400-level requirements.
