Roger "Bud" Bender, 64, and his wife, Jeanette Rose Bender, 65, Oshkosh, died Sunday as the result of a traffic accident.

Mr. Bender was born March 26, 1924, in Oshkosh, the son of Edward and Sophia Bonas Bender.

Mr. Bender was a World War II Army Air Corps veteran, and was a retired machinist for Kimberly-Clark Corp.

Sgt. Roger L. Bender, 1728 Ohio street, was with the 906th bombing squadron. He began his term of service April 20, 1943. He saw action in the Rhineland, at Ardennes and in central Europe. He was decorated with the American theater and ETO ribbons, the air medal and victory and good conduct medals.
