#### Neil Everitt 1/7/2011

Neil Everitt's book "They Fished in Wooden Boats" was launched in front of 200 people at the Port Franklin Hall on Sunday 13th March. "They Fished in Wooden Boats" is a 180 page publication that covers the fishing industry, Corner Inlet, the building and importance of the Great Southern Railway line, the effect the Toora Tin Mine had on the Franklin River and the types of boats used. Neil will talk about the process of obtaining the stories for this book.

Patrick Morgan, writer & academic, has recently published a book on Gippsland literature called "Foothill Farmers". Patrick will talk on writing on Gippsland, why writers (and artists) were attracted to the region from the mid 19th century, which areas they favoured, and how their perceptions changed over the decades.

Historian Liz Rushen is well-known in the Corner Inlet District as she and her husband Peter ran Waratah Hills Vineyard for seven years. Her book "Fair Game" tells the story of the first two ships to bring free women to Australia. Liz tells how this migration was allowed to happen, whilst telling the women's stories; describing who netted them in the hiring scramble and how they ultimately spread their wings. We hope Liz will also talk about her latest project.

#### Arabella Forge 22/7/2011

Arabella Forge is a Melbourne-based nutritionist, food writer and proud home-cook. She works part-time as a Dietician in Moonee Ponds and writes on the topics of food and nutrition for a variety of magazines including Clean Food Organic, Organic Victoria and the South Melbourne Market. Her book "Frugavore" was launched at Fish Creek late 2010.

### Ruth Carson 29/7/2011

Ruth Carson published her debut novel entitled "An Unquiet State" earlier this year. Her talk will concentrate upon the journey to write this book; the development of the story which was subsequently translated into a novel that challenges the perception both of the reader and the writer to the relationship between fact and fiction.
