

So we have a school as 41 languages. We have around 25% of children with special needs. We have some children that are incredibly gifted in the way that they think, creative in the way that they look at the world.

And what we want to be able to do is to give children the tools that can support them no matter where they are in their learning.

No matter what experiences they've got. And for us, the idea of being able to give children a tool where they.

Can showcase their thinking in a unique way. Some children who may want to sketch note what they're hearing so that they can really picture the learning in their mind, where others may want to just type out notes or some people might want to video what they're seeing so they got a reference point in different way.

For us being able to give access to some of our children who have specific learning needs as well, just using colour, filters or children who really struggle to get their ideas out of their head and what they really want to do is to dictate that and using Siri gives them the chance to do that straight away. It's just a tool that can provide a very individual experience for learners, and that's really critical, because what you want to be able to do is to give your children and almost that level playing field in your lessons.

And the tools that we have at our disposal can do that.
