

SBAR Communication Template

What is SBAR?

SBAR (Situation, Background, Assessment, Recommendation) is a structured communication framework designed for clear, concise, and relevant communication in medical settings. It helps ensure critical information is conveyed effectively during handovers, escalations, and team communications.

SBAR Template

S - SITUATION

What is happening right now?

- Patient identification
- Current immediate issue or concern
- Brief description of the problem

Example: "Mr. Smith, ICU nurse calling—his BP dropped to 80/40."

B - BACKGROUND

What is the context?

- Relevant patient history
- Current treatment plan
- Recent procedures or interventions
- Admission diagnosis

Example: "He's post-op from renal transplant, day 2."

A - ASSESSMENT

What do you think is going on?

- Your clinical evaluation
- Vital signs and observations
- Current patient condition



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- Your professional judgment

Example: "He's pale with cold extremities; urine output ↓."

R - RECOMMENDATION

What do you want to happen?

- Specific actions you're requesting
- Suggested interventions
- Timeline for action
- Level of urgency

Example: "Recommend a stat fluid bolus and request ICU review."

Why SBAR Works

- ✓ **Clear Communication:** Provides structure for complex medical information
- ✓ **Reduces Errors:** Ensures all critical information is communicated
- ✓ **Saves Time:** Eliminates unnecessary back-and-forth questions
- ✓ **Hierarchical-Neutral:** Encourages assertive communication regardless of seniority
- ✓ **Safety-Focused:** Reduces "hint-and-hope" communication patterns

Situation	What's happening now?	Current problem
Background	What's the context?	Relevant history
Assessment	What do you think?	Your evaluation
Recommendation	What should we do?	Proposed action
