- artifacts (THINK: the tools/objects the subculture needs to perform tasks)
- built environment (THINK: Setting, how seating is arranged, wall decorations)
- leadership structure (THINK: Who is the leader? How do others fit in? Is there a clear leader or is it not apparent? Established hierarchy?)
- common behaviors (THINK: Things individuals do that others do, as well, e.g. telling jokes, sharing personal stories, wiping down equipment after use)
- common values/beliefs (THINK: Do they have a collective goal? Are their individual goals similar? What values are necessary to belong in the group? Example: Do the members value being punctual? respectful?)
- common rituals (THINK: Things they do <u>repeatedly</u> in the same fashion when they meet together, e.g. every time they meet, the leader reveals the daily agenda, then they break into small groups to complete their tasks)
- common language (THINK: Lingo/Terminology? Formal? Casual? Swearing? Slang?)
- common dress (THINK: Uniforms and/or other identifying clothing or accessories, casual, formal)
- common experiences (THINK: Things they "do" together, e.g. attending a meeting, a birthday party)
- shared history (THINK: Background relationships; relationships outside the subculture and/or before becoming a member of the subculture)
