# AEA Computer Science Support & Department of Education Funding Opportunities

The AEAs are equipped to support districts in preparing their computer science plans to meet the requirements of the Future Ready Iowa Act, <u>House File 2629</u>, which requires all districts to have a computer science plan in place by July 1, 2022. Below is a summary of the requirements for districts, a timeline of when the requirements should be in place, and resources, training and funding available to help districts prepare for next year's deadline.

### A Timeline of Computer Science Plan Milestones and Deadlines:

#### District K-12 CS Plan

• By July 1, 2022: All public and non-public districts must have developed and be ready to implement a K-12

computer science plan.

**Required Instruction** 

Starting July 2022: High schools must offer and teach one-half unit of computer science. The course may

be

offered online.

• Starting July 2023: Provide computer science instruction aligned to the standards in at least one grade

level

from 1st to 6th.

Starting July 2023: Provide computer science instruction aligned to the standards in at least one grade

level

from 7th to the 8th.
