Tips to choosing your classes:

- Fill in all the boxes on the front page. All-year-long classes count as two classes, like English, Spanish or Publication.
 - a. Enter A & B classes into separate boxes. If a class has an A class, you must sign up for the B class too.
- Honors classes typically move at a faster pace than the regular class.
- There is only one AP course for freshmen: AP Human Geography. Summer homework will be published in June.
- Students will be placed into the requested core classes but you may not get all of your requested electives - this is why entering alternates is important! Your alternates are your **second** choices for electives. Counselors often use these to finalize schedules.
- There are LIMITED schedule changes. Please choose your classes wisely.

Choosing **ELECTIVES** for your freshman:

- Study Hall (both semesters) and Health are required electives.
- We highly recommend that your student take at least one PE class - see our course description book for specific pathways.
- World Language is considered an elective. We offer Spanish, Chinese and French; each level is two semesters long (all year). If you have successfully passed Spanish 1 with a C+ grade or above in middle school, we recommend you start with Spanish 2 in high school. Most middle school programs do the high school equivalent of Spanish 1 in two years; therefore, if you have completed one semester or one year of Spanish at the middle school, you might need to start with Spanish 1 at the high school level.

When reading the course descriptions:

1. Be sure to look at the grades that the course is open to; you can only take classes that are designated for 9th graders.
2. See if the course is one or two semesters - if it's two semesters (all year long, 1.0 credit), you'll enter the class in two boxes.
3. Look if there is a prerequisite, for example - you must take Beginning Ceramics before Intermediate Ceramics.
4. Some courses have required class fees, read course descriptions for details.
5. **If an application or audition is required - email the teacher for information.** Do not enter the class in a box; the teacher will let us know if you've been accepted into the class and a counselor will enter it on your requests & schedule.

Before considering a CETC or IC course, please consider the following information carefully:

- Freshmen may only request 2 classes at CETC (one class per semester) **OR** 4 at IC (two classes max per semester)
- Each CETC class takes TWO blocks (2 classes) in a student's schedule, either the morning classes or afternoon classes.
- Students may be placed in AGILE sections of courses offered, which occur on the EHS campus and class is virtual. This option traditionally makes the class one block for 2 semesters at CETC, or 1 block one semester for IC.
- Busing is provided from EHS to these locations in Longmont. Because the CETC/IC morning bus leaves at approximately 7:35am, alternate transportation TO school may be required. The CETC afternoon bus returns students to EHS at/around 2:45pm so alternate transportation HOME from school may be required.
- Students are responsible for packing their own meals when they attend CETC or IC.
- We will do our best to schedule lunch, an elective or Study Hall before or after CETC/IC class, but that isn't always possible; your student may miss a portion of a core class in order to attend CETC/IC.
- **CETC/IC courses must be added to this sheet and requested in Infinite Campus; however, students are not guaranteed a seat for their class of choice and must add alternate course choices.**
