Subject: Announcing the Trans Youth Emergency Project in Iowa

No one should be forced to leave their home state to access healthcare – but right now, transgender young people and their families in Iowa are being forced to travel extreme distances just to access best-practice gender-affirming care. That's because of cruel legislation passed by lawmakers, that inserts the government into

the private and personal medical decisions that should be exclusively between doctors, trans youth, and their families.

Similar anti-transgender restrictions have passed in 26 states, including Iowa, and now we're excited to share that a new project is pushing back on these bans and helping families of trans youth navigate this crisis.
