 Community Colleges:
 - * Open enrollment with high school diploma
 - * No ACT required but placement test
 - * Transfer to 4 year colleges or get degree
 - * Deadline: rolling admissions

Technical Colleges:

- * Open enrollment with high school diploma
- * No ACT required but placement test
- * Degree to enter workforce (very few transferable)
- * Deadline: ASAP certain majors fill quickly, but rolling admissions
- 4 year college or university more money and time commitment but the degree may be necessary and worthwhile for your future career.
 ** Many schools do not require an ACT for admission for next fall!!**

- Again, you will select criteria that can be a good fit for you and at the end you will get a list of schools that you can then compare and learn more about.
- Set up a free account with Corsava
- Sort and rate your preferences to see what you want (and don't want) from your college experience
- Rate colleges based on your preferences and priorities
