Powers:

• Harper is generally a normal person, however she has some natural gifts that could be classified as "superpowers".

Extremely gifted inventor, mathematician, artist

- Harper is often depicted with enhanced hearing, however this is due to the fact that she is often depicted as a fennec fox (a small fox with large ears that give the animal very good hearing), not because she is inherently superhuman.
- The only real "superhuman" ability she has is that she is able to listen to and understand multiple sounds/conversations at one time. In normal people, sound is a sense that is selective, meaning that most people can only track one sound/conversation at a time. However, Harper can multitask in her hearing with ease. This, combined with her slightly enhanced hearing, allows her to gain many times the information from a room than a normal person.
- Harper didn't know that her ability was not normal until she was 17. She had always assumed that people could just hear and track multiple conversations at one time.

Gear: Peregrine Suit

- Abilities Overview: Flight, long-range combat (artillery), medium ranged combat (repulsors), interactive visor, Al system named Zena
- When it is not in use, Harper carries her suit around in its condensed form around her neck. The main unit both holds the arc reactor and serves as a housing unit for nanoparticles. The suit relies on nanotechnology for its simple functionality and easy usage. The suit can be deployed with a simple push. The arc reactor is the source of the suit's energy.
- The suit's wings are mostly composed of carbon fiber, which contributes to its unique rigidity flexibility ratio. The rim of the wings consist of a special gold-titanium alloy, which Tony is known for using as the base armor for his Iron Man armors.

- Another feature taken directly from Tony's iconic suits are the suit's paw repulsors, which are one of the suit's only direct offensive weapons. The repulsors draw power directly from the suit's arc reactor.
- A unique feature about the Peregrine suit is the special visor which is deployed over the user's eyes during the activation. Although from the outside it may seem like just a shield for her eyes while flying, Harper uses the visor in strategic ways on the battlefield. Similarly to Tony's suits, the visor displays a variety of technological accessories. Uses of this vary from labeled battlefield maps to video calls with Blizzy and Tony (interconnected suits)
- A commonly used feature of Harper's Peregrine suit is her personal AI system, nicknamed "Zena". Similarly to Peter's system Karen or Tony's system F.R.I.D.A.Y, Zena is Harper's companion, friend, and personal assistant.
- An underestimated power given to Harper by her Peregrine suit is access to much of the extremely important, classified files saved within the Stark Database. Although she has little interest in looking through the countless files stored within, this is an underutilized perk of owning one of Tony's inventions.

Cause of Death: Dusted in Infinity War by Thanos's snap, revived in Endgame by Bruce Banner's snap

Extra:

- Harper never takes off her arc reactor. She believes that the arc reactor of Tony and Blizzy at their strongest moments, and she carries this legacy with pride.
- Harper is a very skilled artist. She has been drawing realistic renditions and blueprints of her inventions ever since she was very young. Growing up she never had access to the high-tech tools that Tony used, so she always used pencil and paper. Even after she gained access to this technology, her first drafts are always on paper.
- Even though they disowned her at 15, Harper never blamed her biological parents for the decisions they made. As time passes, Harper realizes that they were misguided, but they did care about her. Some days, she regret running away, and wonders what happened to them. But they never attempted to reach out- at least not to her knowledge. Harper knows that they will, when they are ready. She is willing to wait.
 - Harper's biological parents are still alive. Her mother died during the Snap, but returned along with Harper.
 - After being disowned, Harper stopped using her given last name (although she never legally changed it). To most, she is known as Harper Stark. Some people (jokingly) call her Harper Parker, which she finds delightful. However, in the event that Harper and Peter actually marry, Harper will likely keep the surname "Stark", both for identity consistency and to continue the Stark name.

- Harper studied other animals to enhance the efficiency of her inventions. She based her mechanical wings on a real falcon's wings, and studied animal movements to make sure her suit was maneuverable.
- Harper was always one of the most social-media savvy Avengers. Although people like Tony and Steve were more famous than Harper, Harper was very open with the public and was the best line of communication for common people. Her public image began when she won the invention competition, however her popularity grew exponentially after she joined the Avengers. The only lulls in her involvement were the 5 years during the Blip (because she was snapped) and the time between Tony/Natasha's deaths and when Xiaosheng released the news to the public. During both of these times, the public felt the weight of Harper's absence. Harper realized the importance of her involvement, and came back into her online presence to provide comfort and support to the public.
- Harper, out of immense respect and ingrained politeness, insists on calling all adults by their titles and honorifics rather than their names (even when they try to tell her otherwise). Harper calls Natasha "Ms. Romanoff", May "Ms. Parker", and Rhodey "Mr. Rhodes". Harper even calls Tony, her adopted father, "Mr. Stark". This is not because she doesn't see those people as family (she definitely does), it's just out of respect.
 - Harper calls Helena "Dr. Midsummer", even though everyone else calls her "Sorceress Supreme" or just "Helena". Helena secretly likes this, because it reminds her of her doctorate. Sometimes Harper shortens it to just "Doctor", but then Helena and Dr. Strange get confused.
- Even after Tony went off the deep end following Blizzy's death, he pushed Harper away. Harper was heartbroken, but never gave up in trying to help Tony through his grief. Harper spent hours making machines in the workspace they once shared.
 - 3 of the most memorable machines were tiny mechanical animals: a peregrine falcon (nicknamed "mechanic", with working wings and lifelike movements, as well as record sound, separate different audio layers, and repeat each one to the owner), a spider (nicknamed "legacy", with 8 working legs that can climb walls- it could also shoot web and had a built-in radio to sense incoming enemies), and a cat (nicknamed "savior", that could move like a normal cat, fly with mini paw repulsors on its paws, and freeze what it touched).
 - Harper spent many days working on each machine, studying real animals and adding features. Many of the technical aspects of the machines (such as separating audio layers, the radio, and the freezing technology) were made completely from scratch. Each machine was powered by a mini arc-reactor- the smallest ever made by far.
 - Yet, this technical marvel was brushed off by Tony, who was too deep in grief to react even after Harper tried to demonstrate them to him. These 3 machines would be buried with Tony after his death.
 - However, the technology behind these machines would continue to be developed by Harper, with the hope that they could be used for Air Force weapons.
- Harper understands that she couldn't control the deaths of her loved ones, but a sense of guilt follows her still. She desperately wants to protect their legacies the best way she can. From her biological parents to Blizzy to Natasha to Tony to May to Jesse, Harper uses her feeling of responsibility to motivate her every day.
- Harper takes keen interest in other upcoming young heroes/inventors, such as the brilliant Riri Williams or the daring Cassie Lang. Harper makes an effort to

keep tabs on their whereabouts, even going as far as to sneak into their labs or untraceably hack their databases...

Harper is a huge Taylor Swift fangirl. She spreads this love to Akioria and Still.

Harper is quick on her feet, but she has little rhythm when it comes to dancing.
 She can do the basics—party moves, slow dancing, the works—but she lacks the talent that others have on the floor.

Relations:

KEY: L = Living, A = Absent, D = Deceased

- Closest Relations:
 - Tony Stark (D): Tony Stark is Harper's assigned mentor, however he also serves as a father figure. Although he is not her legal guardian, Harper sees him as the father she never had. Tony gave Harper the opportunity to invent without fear of punishment.
 - Blizzy Stark (D): Blizzy Stark, also apprenticed under Tony Stark, is Harper's closest companion and best friend. Over the course of their journeys as heroes, Harper and Blizzy formed a close-knit bond that persevered both in battle and in their normal lives. Harper is an only child biologically, but she considers Blizzy a brother.
 - Peter Parker (A): Peter Parker was Harper's friend even before they knew each other were superheroes; he was one year above her at MSST and they were both on the Academic Decathlon team. They work closely as superheroes and as friends. Peter becomes Harper's boyfriend some months after Endgame. [Marked as absent because of the forgetting spell in No Way Home]
- Other Relations:
 - Biological parents (A): Harper's relationship with her biological parents were always strained. They were distant and were never there for her. Harper's parents disapproved of her inventions, and they disowned her after she expressed her passion for invention and her longing to be a hero.
 - Sam Wilson (L): is Harper's idol and inspiration, which is reflected in her suit. Sam's contribution to the Avengers as Falcon showed Harper that it doesn't take someone with superpowers or fame to make a difference.
 - Jesse (D): Harper met Jesse through Peter Parker, and they became friends immediately. However, after Endgame, Jesse becomes more distant, overwhelmed by grief. When Jesse returns to Harper and Peter's relationship, he is enraged, lashing out at Harper. Peter steps in to stop him, and Jesse retreats. Since their argument, Harper and Peter do not talk to Jesse
 - May Parker (D): May is the aunt of Peter Parker (Harper's superhero ally/boyfriend). Especially following Tony's assasination, May was a motherly figure to Harper. Losing May hit Harper hard, and she would mourn her for a long time.
 - Natasha Romanoff (D): Natasha was one of the original 6 Avengers, and was an inspiration for Harper ever since the Battle of New York. When Harper got disowned, Natasha took on the role of a "cool aunt". Natasha provided support for Harper after Blizzy died, and guided her in her training. After Natasha was assassinated, Harper was devastated.
 - James Rhodes (L): Also known as War Machine (or Iron Patriot), James Rhodes was the best friend of Tony. Most people called him Rhodey. To Harper, Rhodey was an uncle figure, who guided her when the other

- adults in her life were absent. Rhodey gave Harper a job at the United States Air Force, as a weapons designer and inventor.
- Stillwater (L): Still is a teacher's assistant at Midtown. He takes Harper under his wing, offering extra sessions in school to use the school supplies. Harper initially doesn't know Still's hero identity, but she eventually connects the dots after he asks about making a machine more aerodynamic, about crows, and she sees Eddie when he's Evermore.
- Akioria (L): Akioria is sent by Charles Xavier to be Harper's guardian while Harper searches for answers on the murder of her father and mentor, Tony Stark. Akioria is initially annoyed and uncaring, while Harper is energetic and positive and talks to Akioria like they are best friends. Akioria eventually grows fond of Harper and becomes very protective of her.
- Harper is very friendly and outgoing, she loves to make friends of all personalities, ages, genders, and species. Although she is closer with some ACA members than others, unlike some other characters, Harper is not "enemies" with any of the other members.

Backstory:

- 2002: Harper was born as an only child under two working parents. For much of her childhood, Harper was left to raise herself, spending many afternoons after school in her family's small New York City apartment.
- 2012 (The Avengers): After being left in the apartment alone, Harper took to the familiar streets and began the couple blocks' walk to the shawarma joint to celebrate her 10th birthday with her favorite dish. However, this small celebration was disturbed when a beam of pure energy suddenly exploded from the top of

Stark tower and a giant wormhole opened, monsters raining down onto New York City. Stuck in the middle of the fray, Harper struggled to navigate the streets of panicked crowds and explosions. When Chitauri cornered the frightened 10 year old on a street corner, a hero suddenly jumped to her aid. It was a young cat, not much older than she was, with a blue mask with a shining nanotech suit. Quickly pulled away to aid the others in the fight by his mentor, the cat disappeared. However, Harper would never forget the heroic actions of the cat and all of the other Avengers that day.

- 2015: When 13-year-old (7th grade) Harper saw the poster for the annual national Invention Convention, she knew it was too good of an opportunity to pass up. Inspired by former US Air Force pararescue airman Sam Wilson, Harper created a set of fully-functional mechanical wings. Shocking the country and herself with her ingenuity, Harper placed first in this competition. This underdog victory caught the eye of famous billionaire and philanthropist Tony Stark who, from then on, would keep a close eye on the young upstart's progress.
- 2017 (Spider-man: Homecoming):
 - Over the course of the next few years, Harper would be hard at work, trying (in vain) to balance school, friends, and invention creation (with the latter taking the bulk of Harper's attention). Since her original suit's early victory, Harper made new prototypes and designs. After seeing the results of the Avenger's work in Sokovia, Harper is increasingly motivated to push herself to her limits in order to protect her community and her life as she knows it. As she grows older, she begins to realize that she truly does have a gift, and she wants to use it to protect people. If something went wrong, Harper would blame herself.
 - Harper was a freshman (9th grade) at Midtown School of Science and Technology. Excited to start the new school year, she signed up for the school's Academic Decathlon team. Although she didn't know many people, she was happy to start highschool. She bonded with her team members—including sophomore Peter Parker—throughout the year.
 - Harper took notice of Peter's unexplainable absences and tendencies to leave at random times. However, she just believes that he is a naturally distant person, because she hadn't known him for very long.
 - Despite being one of the youngest members of the team, they welcomed her with open arms. Glad to get away from her lonely apartment, Harper accepted the chance to visit Washington DC with the rest of the team for the national championship. The team faced glorious success, and Harper was thrilled. After the competition, the team went to the Washington monument. However, Harper stayed safe on the ground, waiting outside with her teammate MJ (Harper knew the view from the top of the monument wasn't nearly as good as the view from her wings, which were also sneakily disguised as the backpack she was wearing for the entire trip). However, things began to go wrong. The top of the monument suddenly exploded, and Harper was filled with horror as she realized that her friends were in grave danger. Not hesitating, Harper instantly suited up. Along with a mysterious hero named Spider-man, Harper saved her teammates from certain doom.
 - Harper and Spider-man's actions instantly went viral. Both heroes were noticed worldwide for their heroic deeds. This especially caught the attention of Tony Stark, who had been watching both heros' progress. Tony was astounded by the freshman's selflessness and bravery, and decided to reach out to the young hero. Harper was recruited by Tony,

- under the guise of an internship. It is also revealed to Harper that Spider-man was actually Peter Parker, her teammate and school friend. She was surprised but took the news happily. Although this opportunity was a once-in-a-lifetime experience, Harper's bliss did not last.
- When Harper's parents found out about Harper's actions, they were enraged. They told Harper that the hero gig would result in Harper never getting a real job that she could sustain herself with, once they were gone. "You are such a gifted, smart girl." Harper's parents told her. "Don't throw away those opportunities and blessings to become a hero. You'll kill yourself trying." Harper was destroyed, and tried to argue her side. Harper responded, "If you can do the things I do and something bad happens, then you feel like it's on you. I was blessed with so many talents, and I want to use them for good." Harper was also upset because she felt that her parents had never cared for her, never appreciated her, until she did something they didn't like. The argument escalated, until finally her parents snapped. They disowned Harper, forcing Harper to either leave or give up inventing for good.
- Little would Harper know, that her mom was a secret mutant who was forced by her own parents to hide her abilities to pursue a "normal life".
 She wanted Harper to be safe, and she was reinforcing the ideas that her parents instilled in her: that you need to be a normal person in society to be happy.
- Harper was devastated, and turned to the only parental figure she trusted: Tony Stark. After the argument, she ran to her room and locked the door. Hastily grabbing the little belongings she owned, she put on her beta wings and shakily flew to the ACA facility. After arriving on its doorstep, Natasha helped her inside and brought her to Tony. He comforted her, and adopted her as a daughter. Soon, she moved fully into the ACA facility, along with the other apprentices and mentors. She continued her regular schooling, with the additional mentoring from Tony.
- Tony and Harper worked together to create a new set of wings, now known as the Peregrine Suit. This suit would be a major upgrade from the beta wings that Harper had handmade from scraps. The new resources that Harper had access to (and Tony's help and guidance) resulted in the creation of a truly special suit. Unlike some of the suits Tony had made for others, Harper and Tony had made this special suit together.
- Still takes Harper under his wing even more, noticing her talents and academic abilities. They work together on various projects such as Still's drone, Eddie, and trade bird knowledge.

2018 (Infinity War):

Harper was 16, and a sophomore at Midtown. She was on a bus on a field trip to the Museum of Modern Art when Peter caught her attention. She followed his gaze outside the window, where she saw a huge alien spaceship in the shape of a ring. The two heroes promptly suited up and made their way towards the city, with the help of Peter's friend Ned Leeds (who distracted the other kids in the bus). They found Tony, Dr. Strange, Wong, and Dr. Banner, who are fighting the children of Thanos. Peter, Jesse, Blizzy, and Joko showed up halfway through the fight. However, Dr. Strange was captured, and Tony, Peter, and Blizzy followed him into the spaceship. Harper could only watch in horror as her adopted brother and father disappeared into space (She also got harsh flashbacks to the

- wormhole from the Battle of New York). Stuck on the ground, as helpless as a powerless 10 year old, Harper watched her family disappear.
- Harper flew back to the Avengers facility, where she found mentors and apprentices alike in a panic. Harper traveled to Wakanda with the others, including Vision. During the Battle of Wakanda, Harper fought alongside the Avengers, including her idol Sam Wilson.
- However, in the end, the Avengers fail to stop Thanos. Thanos snapped his fingers, and a rumble was heard throughout the universe. Harper, along with half of all life, turned into dust. Her final memory is the stunned face of Sam Wilson; they reach out for each other, but they fade away before their hands touch.
- When Tony and Blizzy return from Titan, they learn that Harper had been turned to dust. They grieve over Harper, Peter, and the other Avengers who had been turned to dust.

• 2023 (Endgame):

- Harper is brought back to life by Bruce Banner's snap, and enters the final battle through Dr. Strange's portal. She makes her entrance with Sam Wilson, the two flying side by side through the portal. She and Tony briefly embrace, both expressing their grief (Harper's from watching him disappear into the depth of space and Tony's from coming home to hear that she had been dusted).
- Canon ACA Ending (without Helena): Blizzy, Tony, and Harper fight Thanos as a trio. However, Harper is knocked to the side. She isn't fatally injured, but she struggles to stand. Zena sends an emergency message to FRIDAY's main system, which distracts Tony. Blizzy charges toward Thanos, grabbing the stones. As he realizes that he is alone in the battle, he finds himself in possession of the stones. Tony and Harper watch in horror as he raises his paw and snaps. They rushed to his side, but there was nothing they could do to save him. The Avengers watched as Thanos' army crumbled to dust.
- Alternate ACA Ending (with Helena): Blizzy, Tony, and Harper fight Thanos as a trio. However, Harper is knocked to the side, and is momentarily stunned. This distracted Tony for a split-second. Helena, who had been watching, suddenly had a vision of Tony's death. She tackled Tony and held him back. Blizzy, who had run at Thanos with the intent of distracting him so Tony could get the stones, realized that Tony was not there. Blizzy took the stones himself and snapped. Harper was horrified. She rushed to his side, soon joined by Tony. The energy surge from Blizzy's snap, in the end, killed him. The Avengers watched as Thanos' army crumbled to dust.
- Harper attended Blizzy's funeral, along with the other Avengers and apprentices. For many months after, Harper would mourn the loss of her best friend and brother. Despite Harper's usually happy-go-lucky demeanor, this loss crushed her spirits harder than any of the other setbacks she had faced.

2023 (Post-Endgame):

After Blizzy's death, Harper was left in tatters. Tony had gone off the deep end, so she was left to find comfort in others. She found solace in her good friend Peter Parker and uncle-figure James Rhodes. Rhodey, in an effort to find Harper a new reason for living and a distraction from her grief, set her up with a job with the United States Air Force, as a designer and inventor. Although it was not a highly-paid job, it kept Harper motivated through the hard times.

- Disaster strikes. Natasha is assasinated by Viktoria (though she does not know who killed her). Less than a month later, Tony is asssasinated by Xiaosheng (she also doesn't know who did this). In the span of a month, Harper not only loses her childhood inspiration and mentor, but also her aunt and father figure.
- Harper goes on with life in a fog. Harper continues to go to school, and attends work from habit. She and Peter mourn together. Rhodey notices Harper's sadness, and does his best to help her. He is mourning too, but he tries to be strong for Harper.
- The news of Tony and Natasha's deaths are held from the public. The Avengers mourn within themselves, but don't want to cause public panic with the news.
- Harper is thrown into a terrible sadness. She retreats from social media and many people in her personal life. Although Harper had alwasy been vocal about her struggles, she completely pulls away from her online image. The public loses their main source of information (about superhero things). The public knows that something is wrong, but they don't know what yet.
- Spring 2024 (During/Post the Falcon and the Winter Soldier):
 - Harper still attends highschool, although her school experience is not exactly normal. Although she is a globally known superhero, inventor, and visionary, she is still a 16 year old kid. Harper had missed 5 years of her life during the Blip, and now must return to something like a normal version of the planet.
 - During the events of Falcon And The Winter Soldier, Harper keeps careful tabs on Sam Wilson and his missions. Although she is not directly involved with the events of the series, Harper followed the status of Sam Wilson, John Walker, and Bucky Barnes carefully (mostly through James Rhodes, Tony's longtime friend). Harper was extremely proud when Sam took the mantle of Captain America.
 - Harper meets a teacher's assistant named Still, who joins the spring semester of her Junior year (2022-2023 school year). Still offers extra lessons and access to school materials. They bond over shared experiences (absent parents, interest in birds, etc.) and work together in various projects such as Still's drone, Eddie.

Summer 2024

- In the time period between Endgame and Far From Home, Harper and Peter Parker support each other as they deal with losing Blizzy, Natasha and Tony. As they become closer, their relationship becomes more personal than just hero partners. They become very close friends, and eventually they catch feelings for each other. They eventually confess their feelings to each other, and they begin dating in this time frame.
- As Jesse begins to reach out again after his drama with Kibo and his grief from his friends' deaths, he notices the change in Harper and Peter's bond. Jesse is insanely jealous of their relationship. When he sees Peter talking with Harper in Harper's room at the ACA Facility, he is overcome with heated passion. After Peter leaves, Jesse confronts Harper, threatening her and reciting a long monologue. Peter, who had overheard Jesse's words, stops him before he can hurt Harper. Jesse retreats.
- Things begin to improve slowly for Harper. She is happy with Peter, and gradually begins to make up with Jesse. Harper looks forward to the MIT

summer program- a program she had been preparing to attend since she was a child.

- Summer 2024 (Spider-Man: Far From Home):
 - Harper is invited on a 2-week Summer field trip to Europe with other students attending Midtown School of Science and Technology. Although she is a year younger than many of the other students (such as her boyfriend. Peter Parker and her acquaintance Jesse), Harper was happily welcomed onto the field trip.
 - The class arrives in Venice, Italy. Harper and Peter are enjoying a relaxing trip, until the water levels mysteriously begin to rise. Soon, a massive Water Elemental appears, wreaking havoc on the city. Harper and Peter, who left their suits back in the hotel, are powerless. Suddenly, new 'heroes' appear- Quentin Beck and Jericho.
 - Peter, Ned, Jesse and Harper return back to their shared room. Suddenly, Ned is tranquilized by Fury. Fury takes Peter, Jesse and Harper to his secret base, where they meet Beck and Jericho. Beck explains the 'backstory' of the so-called Elementals, and Fury asks for the duo's help. However, Harper and Peter decline- they don't feel qualified or ready to fight.
 - Harper and Peter find themselves in Prague after Fury hijacks the class' bus. The class goes to the opera, but Harper, Peter and Jesse sneak out to the carnival- where the Fire Elemental was said to be. Ned and Betty follow them.
 - Peter, Harper, Jesse, Beck, and Jericho "fight" the Fire Elemental. Peter fires a web at the beast, which pulls something out of it. The object lands near Harper, who picks it up and stashes it away.
 - The fight finishes, and Beck asks to meet privately with Peter. Harper and Jesse agree, and take Ned and Betty back to the hotel. Peter and Beck meet at a bar, and Peter ends up giving the EDITH glasses to Beck.
 - Peter and Harper meet up at the hotel and go for a walk outside. This is when Harper pulls out the piece she snatched from the battle. It is revealed that Beck and Jericho were evil all along. Peter had made a big mistake.
 - Peter and Harper go to Fury to tell him the truth about Beck. But turns out to be one of Beck's illusions, and Harper and Peter are trapped in it. They are separated and brought back together, shown images of Jesse, etc. The illusion ends with them being hit by a train. Harper's suit is automatically triggered, saving her from serious injury (but she is still hurt). Peter is not so lucky. Harper drags Peter onto the train, where they both collapse in exhaustion.
 - They wake up in a prison cell and realize that they are in the Netherlands.
 They quickly break out. Peter calls Happy, who picks up the duo in his plane. Peter makes a new suit, and Harper repears hers.
 - Harper and Peter go to the London Bridge, where they face Beck. Happy runs to get Ned, Betty and Flash. Jericho is on the ground, helping citizens get away from the destruction. Jesse is working with Mysterio.
 - Peter enters the illusion of the Air Elemental while Harper runs to face Mysterio. Peter is trapped in an illusion, but uses his Spidey-Sense to destroy the drones. Meanwhile, Harper finds Mysterio and begins to take out his drones.
 - Peter joins Harper, and they work together to kill Mysterio. Peter takes EDITH back and disables all the drones.

- Harper and Peter are in NYC, enjoying a joy ride in their suits. Suddenly, a news broadcast begins to play in the streets. It depicts a doctored video done by Beck that blames Spider-Man for the drone attack and outs Peter as Spider-Man. He also says that Peregrine/Harper was working with Peter to kill him.
- Harper and Peter are stunned and horrified. It was their superhero reputations that were ruined, but also their names.
- Jericho stops going after Peter following his identity leak
- Summer 2024 (Spider-Man: No Way Home):
 - Peter and Harper flee to Peter's apartment, where they talk to Aunt May and Happy Hogan about the situation. Their apartment is surrounded by the Department of Damage Control, and Ned, May, Happy, Peter and Harper are interrogated.
 - They are ultimately released without charge on Peter's name with the help of Matt Murdock.
 - Ned, Peter, and Harper return to high school. However Ned and Peter's MIT applications are rejected due to the recent controversy. Harper is also refused a spot in MIT programs for the same reason.
 - Harper is called by Peter, who was called by Dr. Strange to capture "visitors" brought into their world by an unstable spell. Harper helps Peter round up the "visitors".
 - Strange wants to send the villains back to their universes, but Peter wants to cure and help them. Peter fights Dr. Strange in the mirror dimension and traps him inside. Then, he takes the villains to Happy's apartment. Harper is wary of the villains, but follows Peter.
 - They successfully cure Octavius using Stark Industries technology, however Osborn takes over Green Goblin before the cure can take full effect. Osborn convinces Dillon to remove the curing device. The villains escape, and Harper follows them. However after some time she loses them, and by the time she circles back around to Peter's apartment, it is destroyed and Peter is gone.
 - Harper goes to Ned's house in search of Peter, but he is not there. She and Ned try to use Strange's sling ring to open a portal to Peter, but instead they summon 2 alternate Peter Parkers from different universes.
 - Note: I will be using Peter Parker (H) for Tom Holland's Spider-Man, Peter Parker (G) for Andrew Garfield's Spider-Man, and Peter Parker (M) for Toby Maguire's Spider-Man.
 - Both Peter (G) and Peter (M) are shocked to see Harper, for a variety of reasons. In Peter (M)'s universe, Harper is just a regular girl. In Peter (G)'s universe, "Harper" is a woman named Gwen, who is Spider-woman.In Peter (G)'s universe, "Harper" had died after falling, and Peter (G) had been unable to save her. Seeing Harper as a superhero almost equal in fame as themselves shocked the alternate Parkers.
 - Ned and Harper find Peter Parker (H) on the rooftop, who is comforted by Harper after learning of May's death. Jesse was already there. Harper feels much grief too, because May was a motherly figure to her. Especially after losing Blizzy and Tony, losing May was heartbreaking.
 - Peter (H) meets the other Spider-Men, who share their own stories of losing loved ones and encourage him to fight in May's honor. Peter (G)'s story makes Peter (H) even more grateful for having Harper by his side.
 - Harper calls her good friend and unofficial mentor, Still, to help take the cures. Still was involved in the creation of Nagel's super soldier serum, so

he is very proficient in that science. Harper, Jesse, Ned and the 3 Peters work together to make the cures for the remaining villains. Harper makes the cure for Electro, Jesse and Peter (G) work together to make a cure, and Peter (H) and Peter (M) make the other cures. Still offers advice and a helping hand in the process.

- Peter (H) and Harper share a moment where Peter (H) reveals that he feels like he ruined Harper's life, and failed Tony and May. Harper reassures him that everything will be okay.
- Harper surprises Peter (G) and Peter (M) by revealing that her suit has wings. The Peters also are amazed at Harper's AI system, Zena.
- The Peters and Harper lure the villains to the Statue of Liberty. Ned protects the original bind spell by Strange. They are later joined by Octavius, and they manage to defeat and cure Connors, Dillon, and Marko. Jericho also joined in the fight, this time on the side of the heroes.
- Peter (G) forgot to refill his web shooters, and he went into a free-fall.
 Harper sees him out of the corner of her eye and swoops in, saving him just before he hits the ground.
- Ned accidentally frees Strange from the Mirror Dimension, who seizes control of the spell and desperately tries to protect the current universe as the barriers begin to break down between other universes
- Peter (H) fights and overpowers the Goblin, intending to kill him, but is stopped by Peter (M) who is then stabbed from behind by the Goblin.
 Peter (H) injects the Goblin with the cure.
- The Peters and Harper realize the Jesse had fallen off of the building during the battle. Peter (G) is especially devastated by this. Peter (H) and Harper mourn the loss of their friend.
- Their mourning is cut short when they realize that the multiverse is opening. Peter (H) talks to Strange. To prevent further catastrophe, Strange fixes the spell, sending the alternate Spider-Men and their villains back to their respective universes, while making everyone forget Parker (H)'s existence- including Harper.
- Peter (H) and Harper embrace before the spell officially starts. Harper promises to do anything she can to remember Peter.
- Harper is back to a semi-normal life. She works a part-time government job under General James Rhodes, attends Midtown School of Science and Technology, chats with her friend Ned, and enjoys living in the ACA Compound. She looks forward to attending MIT programs over the summer, and hopes to apply for the college in the upcoming year. Despite the losses she faced, she is happy and thriving.
- Yet, she feels empty. Like a part of her life is missing. Like a piece of her heart has been stolen from her. She has the life she had always dreamt of, but she still feels incomplete. Harper just can't put a paw on what she's missing, but she knows it's something big. Something important. Something that would change her life forever.
- 2025 (Post-Hawkeye, Post-No Way Home):
 - An anonymous news source releases the news that Tony and Natasha were assassinated. Harper and the other Avengers are shocked. They suspected each other, but couldn't prove who actually released the information.
 - The public panics, unable to voice their worries to the Avengers. Harper realizes how important communication between the public and the heroes is, and jumps back into her social media platforms. She releases videos

speaking about loss, mourning, and recovery. She assures the public that

the Avengers are okay.

 This is only half-true. Yes, the Avengers were relatively stable, however by this time, Peter Parker had been forgotten and Jesse was dead. They were greatly weakened still from the battle against Thanos. The OG6 were shattered, and the rest were left to pick up the pieces.

 Yet, Harper's presence calmed the public. Gradually, Harper began her slow recovery. Besides, she had bigger things to worry about- like the gap

in her memory.
