Finding Courage: A Writing Adventure

This <u>unit</u> is designed to support brave writers exploring courage through the power of storytelling. The prompts and resources in this unit are created to supplement Unit 3 - Finding Courage in HMH Intro to Literature G6, but can be used on their own in any writing-rich classroom. Through a four-lesson sequence, students can focus on specific aspects of informational writing such as introductions, details, and conclusions. With definitions, mentor texts, and multiple opportunities to practice writing and each particular skill, students will engage with meaningful prompts and build their skills as informational writers.
