She currently serves as Head of Theatre Curriculum, while also choreographing and assistant choreographing for productions.

In addition to her work at North Shore, Meaghan interned at Stage 284 in Hamilton, MA, where she remains an active performer and choreographer. Beyond her theatrical work, she runs a freelance choreography business and serves as the Assistant Cheerleading Coach at Endicott College.

Meaghan's favorite acting credits include *Elle Woods* (*Legally Blonde*), *Roxie Hart* (*Chicago*), and *Sophie* (*Mamma Mia!*). Recent choreography credits include *Beauty and the Beast* (North Shore Music Theatre), *Descendants* (Stage 284), *Mean Girls* (Danvers High School), and *Finding Nemo Jr.* (NSMT).

Her recognitions include being a METG Musical Theatre Nominee (2014–2016), a 2023 EMACT DASH nominee for Best Leading Performer in a Musical for her portrayal of Roxie Hart, and the 2024 EMACT DASH recipient of the Best Leading Performer in a Musical award for her performance as Elle Woods.
