## Notes - structure

- The song starts with the choir in two parts sharing the chorus sung over a hum.
- into the chant: Which side are you on, I said which side are you on, building up from the bass upwards through the choir
- first verse in unison
- chorus in the new harmony we learned
- verses 2 and 3 in unison
- chorus in harmony
- spoken bit in parts (will try this in rehearsal and decide whether it's the whole part or just one or two voices for clarity) over the chant once as before, and carrying on for a second time with all the parts together, but taking it in turns to drop out and speak
- chorus in harmony
- verses 4 and 5 in unison
- chorus twice

## The sound files

I've used a lot of cut and paste so apologies for the occasional bumpy bit. Note also that if the first word is before the first beat of a bar (The MPs, Their plan), it will not be on the recording, again because of cutting and pasting – sorry, but it saves so much time!
