*Please complete the following steps to **join Troop 815**:*

- Start with [Scouting America](#) (formerly Boy Scouts of America), where you can create a new registration or transfer from Cub Scouts or another Troop. Note your Scout's BSA ID, if you don't already have it.
- Please complete this [Google Form](#) so that we have your contact information to set you up with our troop communication system.
- Troop 815 charges \$250 per year for scouts; \$50 of that fee goes to supporting the troop and the majority of funds stay in a separate account for your son to pay the activities that they participate in.
