

## **LIKE**

similar to: the same as.

preposition + noun/ noun / pronoun

E.g.: You look like your father.

I hate people like that.

## **AS**

express job, function of person or thing

preposition + noun / pronoun

E.g.: Last summer I worked as a waiter in a café.

conjunction followed by subject + verb

E.g.: You never do as I say!

comparison

E.g.: It isn't as expensive as I thought.
