- When people think of ideas about placemaking tour design is very inexpensive and very creative way to engage with others through places.

- Educational ideas, intellectual connections about place

 - Everyone feels ownership over a neighborhood
- How do you think about tapping into community knowledge and leverage that expertise with your expertise?
 - Alternative Schools Network partnership (schools funded by religion mission for students who struggled in CPS schools) to teach youth how to put together a tour.
 - Jahmal Cole My Block, My Hood, My City trains and pays youth to learn about public speaking, engagement.
