

4.07 Complete Draft Graphic Organizer

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Your complete draft should have an introduction, at least two body paragraphs, and a conclusion.

1. Copy and paste your introduction (from 4.05) here in the space below.

2. Using what you have learned about effective body paragraphs to develop the evidence and explanations you already planned in your 4.06 outline. Review the checklist below to ensure you have included:

- At least two body paragraphs
- At least two examples in each body paragraph
- Every example and quotation needs to be explained
- **Your essay needs to have the following types of evidence:**
 - i. minimum of ONE direct quotation introduced with a complete sentence and a colon
 - ii. minimum of TWO direct quotations introduced with a signaling phrase and a comma
 - iii. minimum of ONE direct quotation that is introduced and explained in one sentence

3. Take time now to synthesize your ideas and write your conclusion. An effective conclusion uses a signal word to let readers know they have come to the end of the essay. The beginning of the conclusion often echoes the hook or connects to the opening of the essay in some way. A strong conclusion will not repeat sentences from the essay or include new evidence.
