Tech Tool	Strategies/Ideas Presented in Class	Other Strategies/Ideas
Google Voice	- Change voicemail message to ask students a question they have to respond to (mimics real life conversation)	
YouTube Capture	- Record student discussions to play back (helps students remember ideas, makes them aware of their speaking) - Explain how to do something in 10 sec	
Skype in the Classroom	- mystery skype - author visits	
Wonderopolis	- daily prompt to discuss with students	
Geoguessr	- answer isn't important because we want to hear their thinking (Validates students' home culture & background experiences)	
CargoBot (Coding)	- 1 student explains to the other student how to move the boxes to recreate the picture	
Vocaroo	- record students, put in Google docs or presentation (students can record feedback for peers and put link to in the comments box)	
Google Cultural Institute	- explore with students	
Canva/Google Drawing	- draw, pair, share	
TED/TED-Ed Talks	- be aware of good public speaking habits - TED-Ed has good visual lessons to elicit meaningful discussions - students can do their own TED talks	
Tellagami/ChatterPix/Shadow Puppet/Sock Puppet/Blabberize	- oral fluency, phrasing, intonation (students feel safe behind the avatar)	
New York Times: The Learning Network	- What's going on in the picture?	

Wordle	- teacher creates wordle from text, students have to make inferences based on the clues	
Voices of America	- leveled news articles (students can listen to articles)	
I Spy	- rather than read cards, students have to describe what to find - teacher describes describes something (can practice multi-step directions)	
Educreations/ShowMe	- record students solving problems or work things through	
Newsela	- today in the news (leveled)	
Fact Monster	- 2 truths and a lie	
Thinglink	- visual/multimedia support for ELs speaking in class	
HaikuDeck	- show shark example, discussion over choosing photos	
pechaflickr	- improv a talk from images you've never seen - teachers could create one on a slides presentation	
Picasso Head	- 1 students creates a drawing and has to describe it to another student to recreate	
Cloze/Fluency Songs	- aural discrimination	
Animal Cams/Videos	- students describe scene (without saying the animals name and others have to guess)	
Build With Chrome	- teacher or students describes the structure for others to recreate
