



Regional Stormwater Protection Team (RSPT) Meeting Minutes

Feb 16, 2022 1:00 – 2:30 PM

1. Welcome, Introduction/new attendees & Host Kick-Off - Lake Superior College (Tammy)

- Tammy Wilman shared information about Lake Superior College, a Minnesota State college.
- Tammy's main job is safety at 4 campuses: Center for Advanced Aviation, Emergency Response Training Center, Welding C&C Trainings, and Main Campus on Trinity Rd.
- MS4 is just main location where there is a temperature TMDL
- Civil Tech students check outfalls each year into Miller Creek. There are three rain garden systems. Native flowers also on bioswale. 150 feet above miller creek. Pollinator areas next to parking lots. Infrastructure reduces 50% of sediment at lower parking lot.
- Also have high tunnels for growing food locally.
- Heated sidewalks reduce salt usage!
- Miller Creek Interpretive Trail open to the public


5. Media Team - Karina and Megan

6. Feedback Survey and RSPT Public Participation Events (Lisa)- Took 3 minutes for everyone to complete the survey.


- a. **Majority of respondents wanted mostly virtual meetings with occasional in person.**

 - vii. Lake Superior Day- 3rd weekend in July. The Reserve has always a Barkers Island Event that the City of Superior usually has a presence at! It's a regional event so other events can get held. MN Sea Grant may have done some things in the past on the MN side.

- d. A few mentioned that their pets had destroyed them, cheap plastic is easy to break.
- e. Soft container seems to be more durable? Lots of that hard plastic can be found in stormwater drains...

- g. Also need clean stormwater stickers? Low on those.
- h. Poop fairy bags match the poop fairy's belt
- i. Possible new design for a sticker? Possible to look through what Stephanie created, but leaning toward purchasing what people already love.
- j. Tuomas mentioned poop fairy is too busy to put on a small item. Megan said Lake Superior is a good image to use.
